3) NCDOT Request to Segment U-6029 Phil Conrad

INFORMATION: With the release of the Draft STIP, it has become apparent that U-6029 or the Poplar Tent Road widening may face an uphill climb to gain funding in the near term. NCDOT staff is recommended segmenting this 4 mile project into 2 separate projects that would be scored and programmed independently. The break point would be at the Harris Road intersection where the City of Concord already has a project on the horizon. NCDOT has been conducting an express design on this corridor to ascertain a better cost estimate. As noted this segmentation would require another project slot and additional points from the MPO and Division office to obtain funding in future STIPs. An email from Division 10 staff is included as attachment 3.

<u>ACTION/RECOMMENDATION</u>: 1) Receive a report on the NCDOT request to segment U-6029, Poplar Tent Road widening at the Harris Road intersection; 2) Discuss; and 3) Recommend that the TAC consider endorsing segmentation of the Poplar Tent Road widening (U-6029) at the Harris Road intersection.

4) FY 2020-2029 MTIP Modification #13 Phil Conrad

INFORMATION: MPO staff typically brings amendments or modifications from recent NCDOT Board of Transportation agendas to the TCC/TAC for consideration. The first project modification is the addition of project break for

the Old Concord Road pavement markings (HS-2009E) from Jake Alexander Blvd to the county line. The second project is the addition of a project break for the NC 24-27 reduced conflict intersection (HS-2010F). The third project is the delay of construction to FY 2023 for the Norfolk Southern Crossover Relocation (P-5726B). The fourth project is to add the Clarke Creek Greenway (BL-0060) in FY 2025. delay construction to FY 2023 for P-5726A Salisbury Train station second platform and pedestrian underpass. The fifth project is to delay construction to FY 2023 for the US 29/601 bridge replacement B-5808. The sixth project is to modify the scope and funding amounts for the NC 152 intersection project (HE-0009). The seventh project is the addition of a project break for the NC 152 intersection project (HE-0009A). The eighth project is the delay in preliminary engineering to FY 2022 for the Poplar Tent and Harris Road intersection project (HL-0001). The ninth and final project is the increase in cost of NCDOT Statewide Traffic Operations (HO-0005) greater than \$2 million or 25 percent. Attachment 4 is a resolution modifying the MTIP for these projects.

ACTION/RECOMMENDATION: 1) Receive a report on modification #13 to the FY 2020-2029 MTIP; 2) Discuss; and 3) Recommend that the TAC consider endorsing modification #13 to the FY 2020-2029 MTIP.

5) Performance-Based Planning: CMAQ Targets Phil Conrad

INFORMATION: The FAST Act required that State DOTs and MPOs adopt performance-based planning as a component of the metropolitan transportation planning process. The NCDOT has consistently used the following congestion performance measures for the Charlotte, NC-SC UZA: 1) annual hours (34) of peak hour excessive delay per capita (PHED) and 2) percent (21) of non-SOV travel. Due to the small portion of the Charlotte UZA in Cabarrus County, these performance measures apply to the Cabarrus-Rowan MPO. The PHED is a 4 year target and the non-SOV is a 2 and 4 year target. It is up to each MPO to either adopt these targets or devise their own targets. NCDOT convened a joint meeting on June 10th and all parties agreed to maintain the same targets. These targets were originally endorsed by the MPO in May of 2018. A series of slides from NCDOT outlining these CMAQ targets is included as attachment 5.

<u>ACTION/RECOMMENDATION</u>: 1) Receive a report on the NCDOT developed CMAQ Performance Targets for the Charlotte, NC-SC UZA; 2) Discuss; and 3) Recommend that the TAC consider endorsing the CMAQ Performance Targets as presented.

The May 18, 2022 meeting of the Cabarrus Rowan MPO TCC was called to order by TCC Chairman Franklin Gover. Chairman Gover started the meeting by welcoming the members and called the roll of eligible TCC members and determined that a quorum was met. Chairman Gover continued on by asking if there were any adjustments to the meeting agenda. With none heard, Mr. Ed Muire made a motion to accept the agenda as presented and the motion was seconded by Mrs. Erin Burris. Chairman Gover continued by asking if there were any speakers from the floor. With no speakers being heard, Chairman Gover moved to the next item of business.

Approval of Minutes

Chairman Gover called the TCC members' attention to the meeting minutes of the January 19,2022 and March 16, 2022 TCC meetings included in their meeting packets. Chairman Gover asked if there were any corrections or additions to the minutes. With no corrections or additions being heard, TCC Chairman Gover made a motion to approve both of the meetings minutes as presented. Mr. Phil Collins seconded the motion and the TCC members voted unanimously to approve.

DRAFT 2024-2033 TIP

CRMPO Executive Director Phil Conrad reported to the TCC members that with the suspension of P6.0, NCDOT did not apply their methodology to rank transportation projects across the state or incorporate the local input (MPO) points and Division Engineer rankings/points. The DRAFT FY 2024-2033 TIP was recently released to the public prior to the May Board of Transportation meeting. Director Conrad explained that the TIP includes highway, bicycle, pedestrian, rail and transit projects for the fiscal years 2024 to 2033. He went on to say that the final State TIP is expected to be adopted by the NCDOT Board of Transportation in the summer of 2023.

Director Conrad continued by calling members' attention to Attachment 3A included in their packets which was the CRMPO's supplement for the Draft TIP. Director Conrad reviewed the information item by item with the members. He then moved on to Attachment 3B which was a summary table of the existing project schedules and reviewed the summary table in its entirety. Director Conrad went on to report to the members that certain projects are eligible for swaps although they must be in the same tier. Those requests must be submitted by September 2022. He reported that the City of Concord Regional Airport has requested a swap and that a letter of explanation and support are included in the meeting packet.

Director Conrad went on to call members' attention to Attachment 3C which was a power point presentation describing the development of the Draft STIP. Phil presented the presentation to the TCC members. Once completed Director Conrad asked if the members would like to work on a strategy for the one-on-one STIP coordination meeting with NCDOT. By consensus the TCC members agreed to have staff present this same information to the CRMPO TAC and let them review before discussing the need for a meeting with the STIP Unit.

FY 2020-2029 MTIP Modification #12

Director Phil Conrad reminded the TCC members that CRMPO staff typically brings amendments or modifications from recent NCDOT Board of Transportation agendas to the TCC/TAC for consideration. The first project modification in this request is the addition of a roundabout and traffic signal at NC 152 in FY 2023 for HE-0009 as an economic development project. The second project is to change the funding source to federal for B-5772 the Hurley School Road bridge. The third project is to delay construction to FY 2023 for the BL-0043 North Washington Street sidewalk. The fourth project is to delay construction to FY 2023 for P-5726A Salisbury Train station second platform and pedestrian underpass. The fifth project is to delay construction to FY 2023 for P-5719C or the acquisition of 8 rail cars. The sixth and final project is the delay in construction to FY 2023 for P-5725 Kannapolis Train station second platform and pedestrian underpass.

Director Conrad called members' attention to Attachment 4 which was a resolution modifying the MTIP for these projects. With no questions or comments, TCC Chairman Phillip Graham made a motion to recommend that the CRMPO TAC consider endorsing Modification #12 to the FY2020-2029 MTIP. Mr. Phil Collins seconded that motion and the TCC members voted unanimously to approve.

Proposed STBGP Fund Project Call

Director Phil Conrad informed the TCC members that the CRMPO would like to issue a call for project proposals for the STPBGP funding. The call, Director Conrad reported would conclude on July 31, 2022. CRMPO staff received a total of 4 project requests from 3 project sponsors for the last call for projects. The total cost of these projects was \$20.4 million. Director Conrad went on to report that NCDOT staff has indicated a balance of STBGP funds in the amount of \$21.7 million thru FY 2027. The CRMPO receives a normal apportionment of about \$4 million annually, which is dependent on the TMA designation.

When Director Conrad asked for questions or comments. TCC members voiced concerns regarding the July 31st deadline for submittals. By consensus the members agreed to extend the deadline date to Friday September 2, 2022.

Reports/CRMPO Business

<u>1. Local Reports</u> – MPO/NCDOT Division 9 and 10/PTD - Mr. Phillip Craver, NCDOT Division 9 representative called members' attention to the Division 9 spreadsheet included in their packets. He reported he had no additional information to report but would gladly answer any questions any member had.

Mr. Stuart Basham, NCDOT Division 10 representative called the TCC members' attention to a spreadsheet of Division 10 project updates and highlighted some of the ongoing projects in Division 10. Mr. Basham also provided information to the TCC members regarding campaign signs along roadways. Mr. Basham reported that the signs may remain in place for ten days after the election date.

Mr. Roger Castilla, NCDOT TPB called members' attention to the NCDOT newsletter.

2. 2050 Statewide Plan Public Involvement - Director Conrad reported to the TCC members that he had attended a presentation at the NCAMPO conference on the 2050 Statewide Plan Public Involvement. He has invited Mrs. Nastasha Earle-Young to present the information to the CRMPO TCC members. Mrs. Earle-Young presented the members a power point presentation on The Road to Increasing Public Engagement for Disadvantaged Individuals. The presentation covered options to provide an Actionable Public Engagement Plan. The options included ways to reach people by social media and websites, distributing Table Topic Kits, participating in university and college events, riding trains, targeting younger participation with posters, conducting school district surveys, targeting public transit systems and distribution of interest boxes at municipalities for surveys to be completed and returned.

3. Special Studies Update- Rowan County, Town of China Grove and 2050 MTP Assistance - Mr. Ed Muire with Rowan County reported to members the County's Long Ferry Road Study will begin at the end of May 2022. Mr. Franklin Gover with the Town of China Grove reported that their Main Street Corridor Study will begin June 4, 2022. Director Conrad provided maps and information to the members regarding the 2050 MTP assistance.

<u>4. MPO Staffing RFLOI Selection</u> – CRMPO TCC Chairman Phillip Graham provided an update for the members regarding the selection process for a new service provider. The current contract with Mobility Solutions Unlimited LLC is set to conclude on June 30, 2022.

Chairman Graham reported that the opportunity was advertised for letters of interest and that one submittal was received. He went on to say that one interview was conducted by the selection committee and based upon that interview, it was decided to hire RL Conrad Associates LLC to begin work on July 1, 2022.

<u>5. TAP Project Call- \$1.55 million</u> – *CRMPO Director Conrad* called members' attention to an email included in the meeting packet concerning the project call. He reported that he will send out an email to all members to get interest of when to conduct the call. It was subsequently decided to conduct the call following the STPBGP call in the fall of 2022.

6. 2022 Bicycle and Pedestrian Grant Application Cycle - Mr. Alex Rotenberry with NCDOT IMD reported to members that the submittal time for applications for the latest call for projects had ended.

Subject: U-6029 - Poplar Tent Road (Derita Rd to NC 73)

Phil,

I wanted to follow up with you on our recent discussions regarding the U-6029 Poplar Tent Road widening project. A few weeks ago, Division 10 proposed the idea of segmenting the U-6029 project. This was proposed for a couple of reasons.

- Division 10 staff have noticed that the high cost and the length of the project as a single project contributes to a lower score in STI due to the high cost of the project \$150M
- With the CRMPO funding the intersection project at Poplar Tent Rd/Harris Rd with DA Funds (HL-0001), it now makes sense to segment the project, since the intersection project will essentially divide it anyway
- Segmenting the project at the intersection results in two segments of almost the same length
- The cost of the intersection improvement project can be backed out of the two segments, which will decrease the overall cost of each segment and increase the cost/benefit score. This is effectively where the City receives "credit" for their financial participation in the intersection project
- The lower cost will make the project easier to try to fund since it is competing in the Division Needs Tier which has the least amount of funds available and multiple modes competing for those limited funds

When we last discussed this proposal a few weeks ago, you said you would like to take it before you TCC & TAC for their approval. Division 10 has been working on a Express Design for this project over the last several months. That process is currently on pause until we receive a confirmation from CRMPO and the City of Concord that you are in agreement with the proposed segmentation. Phillip Graham has agreed to the segmentation. I would like to ask that you add it to your agendas for the August meetings so that Division 10 can complete the Express Design process and have cost estimates completed for the two segmented projects.

Please be advised that segmenting the project will require the use of one additional submittal slots for P7.0. One of the segments can take the slot currently occupied by the entire project, while the second segment will require the use of a submittal slot in order to compete in P7.0. We can determine which of us will submit that second segments later on as we both develop our submittal lists for P7.0.

Good afternoon,

As you are both aware, the Draft STIP which was released on April 25th shows the U-6029 Poplar Tent Road project from Derita Road to NC 73) as no longer being a funded project. As part of the process, U-6029 will be rescored for P7.0. Since the release of that document a few weeks ago, we have been talking internally regarding our options for that project. Now that the intersection at Harris Road is funded with DA Funds, it does provide us with some options. I have always felt this project was too long and perhaps not as competitive as it could be due to the length of it and the high cost. Lately, we have been considering segmenting it at Harris Road and dividing it into two sections. Historically, I have had some success in doing that because it does seem to make the projects score better due to the shorter length and the lower cost. The current cost estimates in the Draft STIP are \$91.6M for ROW and \$58.1M for construction. We believe the high cost of this project (\$150M) is making the project less competitive and more difficult for us to afford to take on the entirety of it at one time. Breaking it into two segments will hopefully help with the scoring and the ability to get it funded again.

We would like to check in with both of you to see if segmenting this project is something you are both willing to support. Please let us know your thoughts when you have an opportunity.

WHEREAS, the Metropolitan Transportation Improvement Program (MTIP) is a staged multiple year listing of all federally funded transportation projects scheduled for implementation within the Cabarrus-Rowan Urban Area which have been selected from a priority list of projects; and

WHEREAS, the document provides the mechanism for official endorsement of the program of projects by the Transportation Advisory Committee (TAC); and

WHEREAS, the Transportation Advisory Committee has reviewed the current FY 2020-2029 Transportation Improvement Program, dated October 1, 2019, and found the need to modify it;

WHEREAS, the following attached modification has been proposed.

WHEREAS, Projects listed in the MTIP are also included in the State TIP (STIP) and balanced against anticipated revenues as identified in the STIP; and

WHEREAS, the Metropolitan Transportation Plan has a planning horizon year of 2050, and meets all the requirements in 23 CFR 450; and

WHEREAS, the Transportation Advisory Committee has found that the Transportation Improvement Program conforms to the purpose of the North Carolina State Implementation Plan (*or interim emissions tests in areas where no SIP is approved or found adequate*) for maintaining the National Ambient Air Quality Standards in accordance with 40 CFR 51 & 93; and

WHEREAS, the Transportation Advisory Committee has determined that the proposed modification is exempt from the requirements for determining air quality conformity in accordance with 40 CFR 93.127.

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Cabarrus-Rowan Urban Area Transportation Advisory Committee that the FY 2020- 2029 Metropolitan Transportation Improvement Program dated October 1, 2019, for the Cabarrus Rowan Urban Area Metropolitan Planning Organization be modified as listed above on this the 24th day of August, 2022.







Why are MVEB Revisions needed?

- 2. To accommodate any transportation conformity determinations during the period between the end of the MOVES3 grace period (1/9/2023) and the approval of the MVEBs in 2nd 10-year Maintenance Plan for the Metrolina Region
 - The project list for the next state transportation improvement plan (STIP) is planned to be finalized in late 2022, which will initiate a transportation conformity determination.
 - If travel demand modeling for the STIP conformity process is completed before 1/9/2023, MOVES2014b modeling can be used.
 - If not, MOVES3 must be used, and therefore MVEBs compatible with MOVES3 will be needed.
 - Transportation partners in each budget area will review their respective STIP projects and identify any that might add significant traffic volume.
 - Proposed MVEB revisions should reflect any significant volume increases introduced in the STIP.



Why are MVEB Revisions needed?

- 3. To allow for possible changes in emissions modeling data and procedures
 - Improved Motor Vehicle Emissions Simulator (MOVES) input data is becoming available from new sources (e.g. VIN decoding of active vehicle registrations).
 - Improved MOVES default data are being developed by EPA.
 - MOVES modeling procedures may need to be updated to better align with the EPA onroad mobile source emissions modeling procedures developed for the 2020 National Emissions Inventory.

Brief Overview – Process for Developing MVEBs


- Base year (2014, the year area attained 2008 Ozone NAAQS) and budget year (2026) emissions inventories were developed based on all anthropogenic sources of the ozone precursors NO_x and VOC
- "Safety Margins" for NO_x and VOC were calculated as follows: Safety Margin = difference between base year (2014) emissions and budget year (2026) emissions, per pollutant

Safety Margin Allocation Strategy for Current MVEBs

- Allocations were made at the county/partial county level, as percentages of budget year (2026) county onroad mobile source emissions
- Step 1 2% allocation based on the maintenance area design value that was 2% below the 2008 ozone standard for the base year (2014) all counties
- Step 2 25% allocation to cover future modeling changes all counties
- Step 3a 5% allocation for rapid growth in small counties Iredell and Lincoln
- Step 3b 3% allocation for rapid growth in medium size counties Cabarrus, Gaston, Rowan, Union
- Step 4a 10% allocation for uncertainty in budget year input data all counties
- Step 4b 5% allocation for CRMPO counties to address additional rapid growth Cabarrus, Rowan



DAQ Recommendation for Revising MVEBs

- DAQ proposes revising the MVEBs by increasing the Step 2 safety margin allocation, which was 25% for the current MVEBs.
- DAQ supports increasing the Step 2 allocation to 45%
- Analyses show that at a Step 2 allocation of 45%, 2026 NO_x and VOC emissions based on the latest conformity determination data would in all cases be 36% or more below the resulting revised MVEBs. At the 45% allocation level, safety margin allocation would still not exceed 50% of available emissions.
- The following tables show the effects of increasing the Step 2 allocation from 25% to 45%

Dear Mr. Conrad:

On November 15, 2021, President Biden signed the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) (Public Law 117-58, also known as the "Bipartisan Infrastructure Law") (BIL) into law. The BIL authorizes a new Carbon Reduction Program (CRP) codified at 23 United States Code (U.S.C.) 175 to reduce transportation emissions. The Transportation Planning Division is pleased to inform you that the following funds have been made available to the Cabarrus-Rowan MPO, through the CRP. For Federal FY22, the Cabarrus-Rowan MPO will receive the allocation of \$481,266 in federal funds.

CRP funds are available for obligation for a period of 3 years after the last day of the fiscal year for which the funds are authorized (*See* 23 U.S.C. 118(b)). Thus, CRP funds are available for obligation for up to 4 years. The federal share for CRP funded projects is 80% and will require a 20% non-federal match for projects.

Cabarrus-Rowan MPO is a TMA area and has selection authority per 23 CFR 450.332(c) but should coordinate with NCDOT on which projects are selected to ensure eligibility.

CRP funds can be used for a wide range of projects that reduce emissions. Eligible activities as identified in the statue are as follows: traffic management, truck stop electrification, public transportation, transportation alternatives, advanced transportation and congestion management technologies, intelligent transportation systems, development of a carbon reduction strategy, travel demand management, efforts to reduce the impacts of freight movement, deployment of alternative fuel vehicle, diesel engine retrofits, traffic flow improvements that do not involve construction of new capacity; and projects that reduce transportation emissions at port facilities. Other projects may be eligible with demonstration of emissions reductions. All projects selected must follow Title 23 requirements.

For additional guidance as next steps, we recommend you follow the listed of steps below.

- Identify a list of projects that are eligible in your area. (Minimum project cost is \$100,000.)
- Develop a process for making sure that projects are distributed equitably if you have more needs than funds.
- Identify and ensure that the local government has the 20% local match available and that the total project cost includes an additional 10% for NCDOT project oversight.
- Once you have identified the projects that you would like to fund with CRP funds, email NCDOT-TPD the projects information to confirm eligibility.
- Once NCDOT- TPD has reviewed and confirmed eligibility of projects and issued a CRP Verification Letter with STIP identifiers, then steps should be taken to incorporate in MTP and STIP through the amendment process.
- Once your MPO has received confirmation of project eligibility, the jurisdiction administering the project would then contact NCDOT Local Programs to establish a funding agreement (instructions on how to do this will be in the award letter).
- Once the funding agreement is established and federal funds authorized, project manager follows the process detailed in the <u>Local Programs Management</u> <u>Handbook</u>.

NC Statewide Multimodal Freight Plan

The Statewide Freight Plan (<u>NCDOT: Logistics & Freight - Statewide</u> <u>Multimodal Freight Plan</u>) identifies transportation and logistic investments that support economic growth across NC. The 2017 plan is currently being updated. , the 2022 North Carolina Statewide Multimodal Freight Plan Update will look to the future by:

- •Addressing recent changes in the freight market
- •Identifying ways to enhance economic development opportunities and competitiveness through more streamlined freight movement
- Improving freight system efficiency and reliability while enhancing safety and security
- •Identifying and implementing new freight technologies to improve reliability and efficiency
- •Meeting new federal requirements identified in the latest <u>Bipartisan Infrastruc-</u> <u>ture Law (BIL)</u>, as well as the previous requirements under the <u>Fixing Ameri-</u> <u>ca's Surface Transportation (FAST) Act</u>

The draft plan will be available for public comments from July 22, 2022 to August 22, 2022.

Reconnecting Communities Funding Opportunity

The USDOT has issued a Notice of Funding Opportunity for the Reconnecting Communities Pilot (RCP) Discretionary Grant Program. Funds for the FY 2022 RCP Program are to be awarded on a competitive basis for projects that reconnect communities by removing, retrofitting, or mitigating highways or other transportation facilities that create barriers to community connectivity, including to mobility, access, or economic development. The variety of transformative solutions to knit communities back together can include: high-quality public transportation, infrastructure removal, pedestrian walkways and overpasses, capping over highways, linear parks and trail connectors, roadway redesigns and complete streets conversions, and main street revitalization.

Up to \$195 million is available to for competitive grants through the RCP Program in FY 2022 (\$50 million is dedicated to planning grants and \$145 million is dedicated to capital construction grants). The RCP Program grant applications are due on October 13, 2022. Grant applications must be submitted through https://www.grants.gov. Award winners are expected to be announced in early 2023.Please contact Gretchen Vetter (gavetter@ncdot.gov) if you have any questions or need further information.

National Electric Vehicle Infrastructure (NEVI) Program

Established by the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law, the National Electric Vehicle Infrastructure, or NEVI, Program provides nearly \$5 billion from July 2022-June 2027 to help states create a network of 500.000 electric vehicle charging stations along designated alternative fuel corridors. North Carolina expects to receive up to \$109 million to build out EV infrastructure along its approved corridors.

The Federal Highway Administration's Alternative Fuel Corridors program recognizes highway segments that have infrastructure (or plans for infrastructure) that support alternative fuel options, including electricity, compressed natural gas, liquefied petroleum gas and hydrogen. 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CRAFT Technical Committee Meeting Notes May 24, 2022

- 1. Phil Conrad from the Cabarrus-Rowan MPO began the meeting at 10:01 am and welcomed everyone in attendance and noted some virtual housekeeping details.
- 2. Phil asked if there were any corrections, additions and/or deletions to the March 22, 2022 minutes. Mrs. Randi Gates made a motion to approve the minutes and Phil Conrad seconded the motion. The minutes were approved.
- 3. Phil Conrad asked Mrs. Amna Cameron from NCDOT to present some information on the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act. Mr. Cameron provided a slide presentation on the IIJA and indicated that pressures are contributing reduced buying power at the federal level even with the new transportation bill including inflation due to diesel fuel shortages. With that said, there is a 21% increase in funding for highways in first year and 2% increase for the remaining years, and a 30 percent increase for transit funding as well as about a \$10 million increase in federal formula funds for bridges. She noted the increase in highway costs is greater than the CPI with March 2022 as the greatest increase in inflation in 40 years. She mentioned some upcoming federal discretionary grant deadlines. She noted to 2 new formula funds: Carbon Reduction Program and PROTECT Formula Program. She concluded with a slide that shows the trends for collections of transportation goods and services over the past 3 years. Mrs. Cameron asked for any questions. Phil noted a recent presentation to the Cabarrus-Rowan TAC on the IIJA. Several CRAFT members noted the relevance of this topic and historic nature of the IIJA to the state and region.
- 4. Phil Conrad asked for Mrs. Heather Hildebrandt to give an update on the Statewide Freight Plan. Mrs. Hildebrandt noted changes since the last plan was completed in 2017 including COVID-19, supply chain impacts, work force and labor challenges, extreme weather conditions, and IIJA. She noted the freight plan process as indicated through a graphic beginning with the vision, goals and objectives, and concluding with implementation strategies. She explained the outreach and engagement for the Plan including virtual meetings and reviewing plans of bordering states as well as the online survey. She highlighted the nexus between commodity flows and the needs assessment and project prioritization. NCDOT has forecasted 1.14 billion tons of freight by 2050.

She mentioned the truck parking inventory in 2020 that documented 14 new parking locations with 1300 additional spaces. She stated that a truck parking update will be held on June 8 at 1:30 pm and a freight survey is out for public consumption.

- 5. Phil Conrad asked for Daryl Vreeland and Rich Denbow to give an update on Performance Target Coordination for the Charlotte UZA. They noted the 2 factors for the PM3 coordination: annual hours of peak hour excessive delay per capita and percent of non-SOV travel. He indicated that the baseline performance report was submitted in 2018 with a mid-performance report submitted in 2020 and the final performance period report due October 1, 2022, which would be compiled by NCDOT. He stated that the second performance period baseline report is also due October 1st and would cover 2022-2025. He summarized the affected geography to include the 4 MPO's and 2 state DOT's. The Greater Hickory MPO is encouraged to participate. The peak hour excessive delay is measured for both AM and PM and is expressed in annual number of hours of delay per capita in the Charlotte UZA. It applies only to NHS roads and lower number means better performance. The 2019 target set at 34 hours was not required. The percent non-SOV travel is based on age 16+ work commute only. An example of non-SOV is carpool or vanpool, public transportation, telecommuting, etc. The data source is the annual ACS from Census with 2020 representing an average for the years 2016 to 2020. The most recent ACS data as of August 15th must be used for the year in which the report is due. The target of 21 percent in 2019 and 2021 have been met. He concluded that CMAQ performance plans are due for the 3 NC MPO's and reiterated that 2 reports are due by October 1. He noted that the new baseline report would cover discussion of the 2023 and 2025 targets as well as a description of the region's CMAO projects. Mr. Denbow summarized the next steps in the schedule with CMAQ project emission data available on July 1. NCDOT will submit final CMAQ performance plans in late September.
- 6. Phil Conrad asked for Bob Cook to give an update on the Performance Management Agreements. Mr. Cook recognized Jerrel Leonard to lead the discussion on Performance Management Agreements. Mr. Leonard noted that a previous effort to establish these agreements occurred in 2018 with the MPO's and affected transit agencies. Those agreements were never finalized. There was some discussion about the planning agreements with NCDOT, and the FHWA Certification Review findings for the 2 TMA's. It was concluded that Mr. Leonard would circulate a draft agreement and convene a meeting to discuss next steps.
- 7. Phil Conrad noted the recent Metrolina TIP Conformity Plan kickoff held on June 17th by FHWA. This conformity is associated with any project level changes from the recently release Draft STIP. He highlighted the upcoming deadline for project swaps of September 30th. NCDOT has instituted a swapping mechanism for this STIP only. Mrs. Loretta Barren mentioned the need to review project lists and submit changes to the Model Custodian as soon as possible. The CR TPO is not brokering any swaps, but allowing members to submit requests to them on a defined schedule. The GCL MPO and CR MPO do not anticipate any swaps. It was noted the upcoming deadline in January 2023 to continue using the current MOVES Model. The Model Custodian will send out the project list from the 2050 MTP MRM runs.

- 8. Phil Conrad asked for any comments on project coordination and funding updates. Mrs. Randi Gates gave an update on the Catawba Crossing project. It was noted that project schedules had not advanced in the Draft STIP for projects at the state line. This is a standing item.
- 9. Mr. Phil Conrad asked Mr. Andy Bailey with NCDOT to give an update on the CTP process. Mr. Bailey noted the importance of vision and mission for the CTP and the nexus with the NC General Statutes 136-66.2. He stated that the CTP is a needs-based plan and represents the community's consensus for the transportation system future with analysis of all modes. Every CTP must have 3 elements: identified need, project purpose, and an analysis to support the need. He noted the 7 phases to develop a CTP with a steering committee to develop phases 2 thru 6. He mentioned the 6 facility types for roadway facilities ranging from minor thoroughfares to freeways. He referenced the new symbology for the roadway facility types. He also referenced a new symbology for bike and ped project proposals and public transit and rail projects. He highlighted the planning related data available to MPOs and RPOs thru ATLAS. He concluded the final products are the CTP maps, project lists, and recommendations as well as the inventory table. The primary purpose of the CTP exercise is to detail a reason or rationale for a project recommendation. He summarized that a CTP for Metrolina should include the 2050 MTP projects and the shortfall projects. He envisioned the typical CTP taking anywhere from 18 to 24 months to complete. Mr. Andy Grzymski noted the potential benefit of the CTP process, which might require more work on the front end with a better product at completion.
- 10. Phil Conrad asked Mr. Jason Wager to give an update on the Connect Beyond Study. Mr. Wager noted some slides that could be disseminated to the group. He noted that all NC MPO's/RPO have recognized the final plan. He stated that NCDOT has approved a grant request for a regional TDM program. As for FY 23, the COG is supportive of inclusion of the Connect recommendations into the long range plans for the MPOs and transit agencies. Mr. Jason Lawrence mentioned the coordination of Section 5310 funds for the Remix software application and more on demand planning/service by CATS in the next fiscal year. Mr. Wager concluded that the Connect Project Team will initiate discussions with the MPOs on next steps for FY 23 in July.
- 11. In the interest of time, the CR TPO Strategic Plan will be presented at a future meeting.
- 12. Phil Conrad noted the next Technical Committee meeting on July 26th in South Carolina and will be hosted by Catawba Regional.
- 13. Mr. Bob Cook made a motion to adjourn the meeting and Mrs. Randi Gates seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.
