2) FY 2020-2029 MTIP Modification #12

INFORMATION: MPO staff typically brings amendments or modifications from recent NCDOT Board of Transportation agendas to the TCC/TAC for consideration. The first project modification is the addition of a roundabout and traffic signal at NC 152 in FY 2023 for HE-0009 as an economic development project. The second project is to change the funding source to federal for B-5772 the Hurley School Road bridge. The third project is to delay construction to FY 2023 for the BL-0043 North Washington Street sidewalk. The fourth project is to delay construction to FY 2023 for P-5726A Salisbury Train station second platform and pedestrian underpass. The fifth project is to delay construction to FY 2023 for P-5719C or the acquisition of 8 rail cars. The sixth and final project is the delay in construction to FY 2023 for P-5725 Kannapolis Train station second platform and pedestrian underpass. INFORMATION: With the suspension of P6.0, NCDOT did not apply their methodology to rank transportation projects across the state. The DRAFT FY 2024-2033 TIP was recently released to the public prior to the May Board of Transportation meeting. The TIP includes highway, bicycle, pedestrian, rail and transit projects for the fiscal years 2024 to 2033. The final State TIP is expected to be adopted by the NCDOT Board of Transportation in the summer of 2023. A series of slides describing the development of the Draft STIP is included as attachment 4A. The MPO's supplement for the Draft STIP is included as attachment 4B. A summary table of the existing project schedules is included as attachment 4C.

5) Proposed STBGP Fund Project Call Phil Conrad

INFORMATION: The MPO would like to issue a call for project proposals for the STPBGP funding. The call would conclude on September 2nd. Staff received a total of 4 project requests from 3 project sponsors for the last call. The total cost of these projects was \$20.4 million. NCDOT staff has indicated a balance of STBGP funds in the amount of \$21.7 million thru FY 2027. The MPO receives a normal apportionment of about \$4 million annually, which is dependent on the TMA designation.

RESOLUTION ADOPTING MODIFICATION #12 TO THE CABARRUS-ROWAN METROPOLITAN TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM FOR FY 2020-2029

WHEREAS, the Metropolitan Transportation Improvement Program (MTIP) is a staged multiple year listing of all federally funded transportation projects scheduled for implementation within the Cabarrus-Rowan Urban Area which have been selected from a priority list of projects; and

WHEREAS, the document provides the mechanism for official endorsement of the program of projects by the Transportation Advisory Committee (TAC); and

WHEREAS, the Transportation Advisory Committee has reviewed the current FY 2020-2029 Transportation Improvement Program, dated October 1, 2019, and found the need to modify it;

WHEREAS, the following attached modification has been proposed.

WHEREAS, Projects listed in the MTIP are also included in the State TIP (STIP) and balanced against anticipated revenues as identified in the STIP; and

WHEREAS, the Metropolitan Transportation Plan has a planning horizon year of 2050, and meets all the requirements in 23 CFR 450; and

WHEREAS, the Transportation Advisory Committee has found that the Transportation Improvement Program conforms to the purpose of the North Carolina State Implementation Plan (*or interim emissions tests in areas where no SIP is approved or found adequate*) for maintaining the National Ambient Air Quality Standards in accordance with 40 CFR 51 & 93; and

WHEREAS, the Transportation Advisory Committee has determined that the proposed modification is exempt from the requirements for determining air quality conformity in accordance with 40 CFR 93.127.

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Cabarrus-Rowan Urban Area Transportation Advisory Committee that the FY 2020- 2029 Metropolitan Transportation Improvement Program dated October 1, 2019, for the Cabarrus Rowan Urban Area Metropolitan Planning Organization be modified as listed above on this the 25th day of May, 2022.

Call to Order

TAC Chair Meredith Bare Smith called the March 23, 2022 meeting of the Cabarrus Rowan MPO TAC to order at approximately 5:35 pm. Chairwoman Smith welcomed all in attendance and asked all present to recite the Pledge of Allegiance to a flag displayed on their screens. After reciting the pledge, Chair Smith called the roll of eligible voting TAC members and determined that a quorum had been met.

She continued by reading the NC State Ethics Commission Ethics Awareness and Conflict of Interest requirement and asked that should a conflict arise during any part of the meeting, TAC members should recuse themselves from that portion of the meeting.

Chairwoman Smith asked for any Chamber of Commerce updates. Mrs. Elaine Spaulding from the Rowan Chamber reported on upcoming events with the Rowan Chamber which included A Job Fair on April 1, the Power in Partnership meeting on April 21, and the Dragon Boat Race on July 23. Mr. Alex Rankin with the Cabarrus Chamber reported to TAC members that the Chamber's Legislative Breakfast is being held on April 8th and that registration can be done online. Moving on, TAC Chairwoman Smith asked if there were any speakers from the floor who would like to speak. With none heard, she moved on to the next order of business.

CRMPO Director Phil Conrad introduced Mr. Eddie McFalls with NCDOT's Rail Division. Mr. McFalls provided a power point presentation to the TAC members. The presentation covered the status on the Southeast Corridor Planning, then Piedmont Corridor Service Enhancements, an explanation of the Phase 1 and 2 of the plans for the Charlotte Gateway Station and in closing reported on funding opportunities for these initiatives. With few questions or discussion Director Conrad thanked Mr. McFalls for his presentation and information.

Chair Smith asked if there were any adjustments to the meeting agenda including the Consent Agenda. Director Conrad made a request to add an item to the bottom of the list under Reports regarding the NC Ethics Commission requirements. FY 2020-2029 MTIP Modification #11

The first project modification is the delay right-of-way to FY 2023 for EB5732 Bruton Smith Blvd sidewalk. The second project is to add project segmentation to P-5726A Salisbury Train station second platform and pedestrian underpass at the request of the Rail Division. The third project is to add project segmentation to P-5726B Salisbury Norfolk Southern crossover relocation.

RIDER Public Transportation Agency Safety Plan

The Public Transportation Agency Safety Plan (PTASP) final rule (49 C.F.R. Part 673) requires certain operators of public transportation systems that are recipients or subrecipients of FTA grant funds to develop safety plans that include the processes and procedures necessary for implementing Safety Management Systems (SMS). The PTASP was approved by the Concord Kannapolis Area Transit Commission on February 1, 2022 and will go to the Concord City Council for approval following action by the MPO. Approval of January 26, 2022 Minutes

Chairwoman Smith called members' attention to the minutes from the January 26, 2022 meeting included in their meeting packets. Chairwoman Smith asked if there were any corrections or additions to the minutes. With none being heard, Mr. J.C. McKenzie made the motion to approve the minutes as presented. Mr. Ron Smith seconded the motion and the TAC members followed with a unanimous vote to approve.

2050 MTP and Transportation Conformity Update

Director Phil Conrad reminded TAC members that the Cabarrus-Rowan MPO and the Metrolina Regional Partners have been working on the Transportation Conformity Analysis and Determination Report. This report demonstrates that the financially constrained MTP's in the Metrolina Region meet national ambient air quality standards. He explained that it also certifies that the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) is a subset of the 2050 MTP, and that the Conformity Report is consistent with the approved State Implementation Plan (SIP) by EPA.

Director Conrad proceeded to show the TAC members a power point presentation which explained what the Transportation Plan is and the elements of the Plan. He also provided information on the financial constraints, funding sources and revenue forecasts. Information on key projects funded by 2025, 2035, 2045, and 2050 as well as what transit projects are funded. Phil also went on the explain what Conformity is and how it relates to the Transportation Plan while also reviewing motor vehicle emission budgets. He further noted that the draft 2050 MTP report is posted on the MPO website at www.crmpo.org/Plans/Mobility, with an executive summary provided in the packet. He noted that the public comment period has concluded with no comments received.

He called members' attention to Resolution 6B for endorsing the 2050 MTP and Resolution 6C to endorse the Metrolina Conformity Determination Report. With no questions or discussion, Mr. JC McKenzie made a motion to endorse the 2050 MTP. Mrs. Karen Alexander seconded the motion and the TAC members voted unanimously to approve. Following this item, Mr. JC McKenzie made another motion to endorse the Metrolina Conformity Determination Report. Mr. Ryan Dayvault seconded that motion and the TAC members voted unanimously to approve.

Proposed Statewide CMAQ Project Submittal

Director Phil Conrad reported to the members that CMAQ or Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality funds are a federal funding source for areas designated non-attainment by the EPA. CMAQ funds require a local sponsor and a 20 percent local match. He explained that eligible projects must demonstrate an emissions reduction benefit to the local area. NCDOT has issued a call for new project applications that must be submitted by the end of March 2022. He highlighted a CMAQ project proposal for improvements to the waiting room at the Salisbury Amtrak rail station submitted by the City of Salisbury. Mrs. Wendy Brindle with the City of Salisbury provided the members with a power point presentation that reviewed the request and the project itself. Mr. McKenzie complimented the City of Salisbury on this application. With no additional comments, Director Conrad called members' attention to Resolution 7B in their packets which would support this new CMAQ project for statewide funds and noted that this competitive category of CMAQ funds is in addition to the funds suballocated by NCDOT directly to the CR MPO and other non-attainment MPO's. Chairwoman Smith made a motion to endorse the statewide CMAQ Project submittal as presented. Mr. Ryan Dayvault seconded that motion and the TAC members voted unanimously to approve.

FY 2022-2023 DRAFT UPWP

Director Conrad reminded the members that each year the Cabarrus-Rowan MPO develops and adopts a unified planning work program (UPWP), which is the MPO budget and follows the state fiscal year 2022-2023. He stated that the UPWP identifies the planning tasks, responsible agencies, and funding sources for regional transportation planning activities to be conducted within the planning area during the next fiscal year. He said that these projects include MPO planning activities undertaken by local agencies, the N.C. Department of Transportation, and a line item for Regional Model and MTP Maintenance. He noted that NCDOT has published an allocation in FY 23 to the MPO in the amount of \$354,600. He also explained that the Federal government require all MPO's to certify their transportation planning process on an annual basis. He referenced Attachment 8B in their packet which was a checklist for the CR MPO to certify the MPO transportation planning process He also noted that the local match table in their meeting packet or Attachment 8C is using the 2010 Census numbers. Director Conrad then reviewed the UPWP line item by line item with the members. In closing he called members' attention to Attachment 8D which was a resolution adopting the UPWP.

With no questions or comments, Mrs. Karen Alexander made a motion to adopt the FY 2022-2023 UPWP. Mr. Ron Smith seconded her motion and the TAC members voted unanimously to approve. Mr. Ron Smith then made a motion to certify the CRMPO Transportation planning process with Mr. Charles Seaford seconding the motion. The TAC members voted unanimously to approve.

Reports/CRMPO Business

1. Local Reports - NCDOT Division 9 & 10 – Mr. Pat Ivey, NCDOT Division 9 informed TAC members that Division 9 Updates are included in their meeting packet. He offered to discuss any projects on the list with members.

Mr. Stuart Basham, NCDOT Division 10 representative called TAC members' attention to a spreadsheet of Division 10 project updates. He reviewed some of the ongoing projects in Division 10. Mr. Basham also informed members that the deadline for Bike and Pedestrian Planning Grant applications is May 9, 2022 and that volunteers are needed once again for the NCDOT Litter Sweep between April 16 to 30th.

- 2. STBGP Fund Transfer Mr. Mike Stanley, NCDOT TIP Unit provided information on this item and referenced a copy of an email from him included in their packets for the transfer of STPBGP funds related to the Coach Deal Drive/Kimball Road Extension project.
- Special Studies Update Rowan County, Town of China Grove, and 2050 MTP Assistance
 Director Conrad gave a brief update on the 3 special studies that are ongoing in the fiscal year.
- 4. FY26 STBGP Balance and 2022 Project Call CRMPO Director Conrad reported that information was included in the packet for their information and review.
- 5. SEI Filing Deadline April 18, 2022 and NC Ethics Commission Newsletter Director Conrad called the TAC members' attention to this information included in their packets as a reminder to complete the NC Ethics Commission requirements by the deadline.




Remaining Seniority Projects







			AV-5889 is planned for FY 26

At this point, any swaps will have to be based on the newly released draft STIP; so here is the status of each project and the swap possibilities:

AV-5889 – the newly released Draft STIP has \$300 K programmed in FY 23

AV-5892 – this project was not funded in the newly released Draft STIP

For this swap we could program \$300 K for AV-5892 in FY 23 and AV-5889 would be unfunded and would have to recompete for funding

All swaps have to be approved by both the division engineer and the planning organization. Either Aviation or the airport could kick off the swap request be contacting the either the division or planning organization. We need to have all swaps completed by September 30.

Another point to keep in mind on these projects and any other statewide or regional funded project. If a decision is made to give an airport multiple years of funding (i.e. \$300 K for two fiscal years) instead of the one year of funding that is typically shown in the STIP, the division engineer will have to approve this change.

Introduction

On December 4, 2015, the President signed the Fixing America's Surface Transportation (FAST) Act into law. The FAST Act changed the Surface Transportation Program (STP) name to the Surface Transportation Block Grant Program (STBGP) and amended the provisions contained in 23 U.S.C. 133. From the STBGP funds apportioned to each state for the state's entire Federal- aid system, a portion the FAST Act allocates STBGP funds directly to any Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) that is designated as a Transportation Management Area (TMA). STBGP funds have broad latitude for use on metropolitan transportation planning and projects and in support of the Federal-aid system per 23 U.S. C. 133. Specific eligibility criteria and guidance can be found through the Federal Highways Administration (FHWA www.fhwa.dot.gov).

As a Transportation Management Area (TMA), the Cabarrus-Rowan Metropolitan Planning Organization (CRMPO) receives a direct allocation of STBGP funding annually. This direct allocation is referred to by the CRMPO as Surface Transportation Block Grant Program Direct Attributable (STBGP-DA). The Fast Act also combined the former STP and former TAP programs at the federal level, and amended the provisions contained in 23 U.S.C. 133. Prior to apportioning the STBGP funds to each state or MPO, a portion the FAST Act sets aside STBGP funds specifically for Transportation Alternatives which is now referred to as the Transportation Alternative Set Aside (TASA). From the TASA funds apportioned to each state, a portion of the FAST Act allocates TASA funds directly to any Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) that is designated as a Transportation Management Area (TMA). As a Transportation Management Area (TMA), the Cabarrus-Rowan Metropolitan Planning Organization (CRMPO) will receive a direct allocation of TA Set Aside funding annually. A competitive process has previously been adopted to determine which projects are funded.

Eligibility Criteria

In order to be eligible for either Surface Transportation Block Grant Program – Direct Attributable, a project must meet the minimum criteria outlined in this section. Also, a completed application must be submitted by the applicant(s). Incomplete applications will not be considered. These criteria meet federal and state funding requirements, as well as the goals of the CRMPO for STBGP-DA dollars as adopted by the MPO Board or TAC. Projects that do not meet these criteria will not be considered for funding. The federal eligibility requirements associated with Surface Transportation Block Grant Program can be found in 23 USC §133 (https://www.fhwa.dot.gov/specialfunding/stp/160307.cfm.

Minimum Eligibility Requirements

- 1. What are the minimum eligibility requirements for a project?
 - Project is a federal-aid eligible project consistent with the statutory requirements of 23 USC 133(c). All roadways submitted for improvements must be part of the Federal Aid System.
 - Resolution of support from the municipality/applicant indicating an understanding of the obligations related to funding the project/program.
 - Commitment to provide the 20% local match and to administer the project to completion *unless otherwise specified by USDOT Notice*.
 - Project consistent with the currently adopted CRMPO Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) or other applicable adopted local Plan or CTP
 - Project sponsor must be an MPO member in good standing, and could include local transit agencies

STBG Eligible Activities

- Roadway projects on roadways other than local or rural minor collectors (with some exceptions)
- Construction, reconstruction, rehabilitation, resurfacing, preservation, or operational improvements for highways
- Replacement of bridges and tunnels on public roads of all functional classifications; construction of a new bridge or tunnel at a new location on a Federal-aid highway
- Capital cost for transit projects eligible for assistance under chapter 53 of title 49, which includes vehicles and facilities that are used to provide intercity passenger bus service
- Carpool projects, fringe and corridor parking facilities and programs
- Electric vehicle and natural gas vehicle infrastructure in accordance with 23 U.S.C 137
- Bicycle transportation and pedestrian walkways in accordance with 23 U.S.C. 217; modification of public sidewalks to comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990

- Highway and transit safety infrastructure improvements and programs, hazard elimination
- Capital and operating costs for traffic monitoring, management, and control facilities and programs, including advanced truck stop electrification systems
- Truck parking facilities
- Congestion pricing projects and strategies
- Surface transportation planning programs or as amended

Eligible Costs

Only certain costs are eligible for reimbursement. An obligation occurs when a project is approved and a project agreement is executed between the Federal government (FHWA division offices) and the State and/or the MPO. Although considerable time and money may have already been spent developing a project, an obligation marks the beginning of project costs which are eligible for reimbursement. Any design and feasibility studies conducted prior to receipt of a Notice to Proceed are not eligible.

After obligation many project specific costs are eligible. Preliminary and final engineering work including project development, environmental work, cost estimates, construction plans, and architectural work are eligible after approval is received by the administering agency. Utility relocations, construction engineering, and construction costs would also be eligible. Right-of-way property rights required for projects and the acquisition of this ROW will be an eligible expense. The acquisition of real property is subject to the Uniform Act. If requesting funds for Construction and earlier stages of the project, such as Design / Preliminary Engineering and Right-of-Way, have already been completed, those activities must have been completed following Federal guidelines.

Local Match

The Federal government will pay for up to 80% of eligible project costs *unless specified by* USDOT. The applicant/sponsor is required to pay for 20% or more of the remaining project costs (local match). *In cases where the federal match is greater than 80%, the applicant/sponsor will be required to provide a match of 10% at a minimum.*

Project Minimums and Maximums

Project minimum of \$250,000 and project maximum is uncapped.

Project Selection Process

Projects would be awarded through a competitive selection process with points assigned by a subcommittee of TCC staff members who do not have a project in the list for evaluation and presented to the TCC for recommendation, which would be carried to the TAC for approval.

Project Evaluation Criteria

The following is the criteria for evaluation of projects submitted under this program:

1. Project Needs/Goals and Objectives: The project should directly address priority transportation needs within the Cabarrus-Rowan MPO Planning Area as described in MPO's Transportation Plan other applicable adopted local Plan or CTP. Project applications should clearly state the overall program goals and objectives, and demonstrate how the project will benefit the community. **(0 to 20 points)**

2. Promotes Safety and Security: The project improves an existing hazardous condition. To receive full points, project sponsor must provide a complete description with supporting documentation of the hazardous condition. **(0 to 15 points)**

3. Documented Project/Program Support: Applicants must submit documentation that shows local support for the project/program in the form of an official resolution. Other support could include letters from affected citizens, advisory boards or commissions, sheriffs or police, neighborhood associations, or business groups. **(0 to 20 points)**

4. Proximity to Existing/Planned Traffic Generators: The project is in proximity to traffic generators such as residential or commercial areas, schools and other institutional uses, parks, libraries, etc. Applicant must describe proximity to, and connection with existing/planned transportation system and how it will improve access to the facilities. **(0 to 15 points)**

5. Quantifiable measures for effectiveness in addressing congestion through innovative or multimodal approaches/applications. (Reduces single occupant vehicle use – 10 points; Reduces peak hour congestion volume – 5 points; Improves travel time on corridor – 1 point)

6. Connectivity measures for linking other modes. (0 to 10 points)

Bonus Points

A. Funding - Commitment to amounts higher than the 20 percent local match may result in higher assigned points depending on the percent to complete. Sliding scale for each additional 10 percent local match. **(5 points)**

B. Geographic equity – Projects serving populations less than 20k. (5 points)

C. Innovation - Projects will be examined to see if it contains new or innovative service concepts or facilities that have the potential for improving access and mobility. **(5 points)**

D. Progress - Bonus Points will be assigned for shovel ready projects with completed preliminary design, permitting, etc. **(5 points)**

Project Implementation Timeline

Each phase of a project with STBG-DA can apply for 2 two-year extensions beyond the allocation year. If project funds remain un-obligated by the end of this four-year grace period, funds are at risk of being removed from the project. The project sponsor will provide regular reports to both the TCC and TAC of those STBG-DA projects subject to removal.

Project Budget

Cost Estimation Requirements

Each discretionary project submittal must contain the following to satisfy the MPO's cost estimation requirements:

• A detailed cost estimate that has been prepared by a design professional working in the area of their expertise.

• Cost estimates shall be <u>no more</u> than six months old from date of project submittal.

• Cost estimates shall be prepared for full project implementation—including all applicable activities, such as preliminary engineering, environmental documentation, right-of-way acquisition, utilities relocation, and construction.

Sample Project Budget

The following table illustrates the calculated budget for a sample project in which no engineering/ design has been completed:

Preliminary Engineering Cost and Inspection

Project cost estimates are required to include at least an additional 25% of construction cost for Preliminary Engineering (PE).

Construction Engineering Inspections Estimated Costs Project cost estimates will be required to include at least an additional 15% of construction costs for Construction Engineering Inspections (CEI).

Supporting Documents

Pictures with labels, additional maps, resolutions adopting plans that specify a need for the project, etc. (Resolutions supporting plan must have been adopted prior to call for projects)

Project Implementation

Preparing and executing a Project Agreement is the most important step in implementing a project. Without an agreement, the project cannot move forward. The Local Government Agency (LGA) and NCDOT will execute a Project Agreement that includes the project schedule and addresses the relevant federal and state regulations governing the implementation of the Project. Each party must adhere to all provisions in order for funding obligation to occur. Any modifications, deletions, or additions to the Project Agreement must be agreed to in writing by both parties. Changes to the schedule may require a STIP Amendment, a supplement to the Local Project Agreement, and a change to the Baseline Schedule managed by the Schedule Management Office, or possible withdrawal of funds from the project.

The process is coordinated by NCDOT's Local Programs Management Office, and more information can be found at https://connect.ncdot.gov/municipalities/Funding/Pages/LPM%20Handbook.aspx.

Funding Authorization Overview

Funding Authorization is how federal and state funds are obligated for use on the project. Any costs incurred for work performed prior to the authorization of funds will not be eligible for reimbursement. The steps to achieve funding authorization will be required for each project phase as reflected in the Project Agreement and in the Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP).

The three phases are:

- Preliminary Engineering (PE)
- Right of Way (ROW)
- Construction (CON)

NCDOT will notify the LGA in writing when funding is authorized and expenses may be incurred. Funding Authorization may take as long as two weeks.

NOTE: If a project has been funded for Construction only, for instance, and earlier stages of the project, such as Design / Preliminary Engineering and Right-of-Way, have already been completed, those activities <u>must</u> have been completed following Federal guideline.

Preliminary Engineering & Design

Preliminary Engineering (PE) Authorization allows the LGA to be reimbursed for costs related to preconstruction activities, including planning, environmental documentation, design, and surveys. PE funding may be adjusted after the review and approval of a consultant contract. PE expenses should be monitored so that it stays within this range; additional funds may not be available.

Environmental Documentation

All federally-funded projects must comply with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) before right-of-way or construction funds can be authorized. An environmental document ensures that the project has been reviewed for potential impacts to the natural, cultural, and human environment. LGAs are responsible for undertaking environmental review, obtaining appropriate clearances or approvals, and submitting documentation to NCDOT for final review and signatures.

Right-of-Way Acquisition & Certification

The LGA is responsible for ensuring that sufficient right-of-way (ROW) exists for the project. Either the project can be constructed within existing ROW/easements/property that can be documented, or the LGA will need to acquire new ROW/easements/property. If it is necessary to acquire right of way, the LGA must comply with the Uniform Act (49 CFR 24 - Uniform Relocation Assistance & Real Property Acquisition for Federal & Federally-Assisted Programs.) ROW Certification is issued by the Division ROW Agent for the county where the project is located, after receiving a request from the LGA accompanied by required documentation. Once property is acquired, the LGA will be responsible for providing documents to obtain ROW Certification from the Division ROW Agent.

Construction

Construction contracts must be awarded to the lowest responsible, responsive bidder after advertisement and solicitation of competitive bids. NCDOT must concur in the award of a construction contract by the LGA.

Reimbursement

The LGA must pay 100% of the project costs and then request reimbursement. Generally, the reimbursement rate is 80%, which means the LGA must pay 20% of project costs. Final reimbursement will not be made until the project has been inspected and accepted by the Department. Interim-step reimbursement may be allowed, based on the terms of the Municipal Agreement.

<u>Closeout</u>

Close-Out refers to the process of obtaining a final inspection of the project from NCDOT, performing a final acceptance, submittal and reimbursement of final pay request, and the start

of the records retention period. The FHWA and State of North Carolina requires that records relevant to the project should be maintained for three (3) years after final voucher is issued. All records shall be maintained by the Local Government Agency, not the contractor or the Professional Engineering Firm that provided construction administration.

Please accept this letter of support for the **Mobility for Everyone, Everywhere in North Carolina (MEE NC)** grant application to the U.S. Department of Transportation's Rural Surface Transportation Grant Program (RURAL). MEE NC advances the North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT) Integrated Mobility Division (IMD)'s vision and strategy to partner with the state's rural transit systems to launch on-demand microtransit throughout the state. Expanding on-demand mobility options will respond to unmet transit needs, provide a more equitable transportation system, and improve access to opportunities, services, and resources for transportation disadvantaged populations.

Microtransit is a technology-enabled transit service that uses shuttles or vans to provide pooled, on-demand transportation with dynamic routing. It provides several benefits to riders including more efficient and responsive service, reduced wait and travel times, and flexibility to address changing mobility needs. MEE NC will fund on-demand services tailored to each community's needs and vision. On-demand service zones are designed specifically to address local gaps in the transit system and were informed by the NCDOT's Equity and Transportation Disadvantage Screening Tool that identifies populations facing barriers to accessing transportation based on six quantitative indicators.

Rural transportation challenges in North Carolina are a formidable barrier to accessing critical services and opportunities, particularly for residents with lower incomes, disabilities, and without access to a vehicle. These challenges are the root cause of poorer health outcomes, reduced safety, and limited economic competitiveness and exacerbate existing geographic, racial, and economic inequities. By addressing rural public transportation, MEE NC will tangibly and meaningfully improve the lives and economies of North Carolinians by increasing rural populations' access to employment opportunities, healthcare, and other essential services.

The Project will modernize transit service in rural areas across the state by introducing Software as a Service (SaaS) and Transportation as a Service (TaaS) microtransit service models to serve transportation disadvantaged populations more effectively and enable vulnerable users across the state to access critical services and opportunities. MEE NC will leverage the experience and insights from existing microtransit services in the state such as Wilson RIDE, which has seen a 150% increase in transit ridership since replacing its fixed-route system in September 2020. Building upon these successes, MEE NC will significantly reduce wait times, improve travel time reliability, and expand transit service.

NC Clean Transportation Plan

In January 2022, Gov. Roy Cooper signed <u>Executive Order 246</u>, "North Carolina's Transformation to a Clean, Equitable Economy."

EO 246 Goals:

•Reduce economy-wide greenhouse gas emissions to at least 50 percent below 2005 levels by 2030 and achieve net-zero emissions no later than 2050.

•Increase the total number of registered, zero-emission vehicles to at least 1,250,000 by 2030 and increase the sale of ZEVs so that 50 percent of in-state sales of new vehicles are zero-emission by 2030.

Clean Transportation Plan:

As part of EO 246, the NCDOT is tasked with developing a Clean Transportation Plan (NCCTP) within 15 months of the order. On April 1, a virtual public information meeting was held.

By working with stakeholders, the N.C. Clean Transportation Plan will outline the near-term strategies North Carolina can use to reduce greenhouse gas emissions, increase the use of zero-emission vehicles, advance environmental justice and create good-paying jobs tied to clean transportation.

We need your feedback. We invite you to participate in <u>a short survey</u> to share your thoughts on North Carolina's clean transportation future. Please share widely with your friends and colleagues.

Five workgroups will convene from April to September to address the challenges and leverage the opportunities to advance clean transportation in North Carolina. These workgroups will develop action plans in the following five areas:

Zero-emission vehicle (ZEV) plan for light-duty vehicles, which will focus on the opportunities to advance the transition of passenger cars and trucks to zero-emission vehicles.

Zero-emission vehicle (ZEV) plan for medium- and heavy-duty vehicles, which will develop an action plan to transition delivery trucks, construction equipment and other large vehicles to zero-emission vehicles.

FHWA News

On November 15, 2021, President Biden signed the <u>Infrastructure Invest-</u> <u>ment and Jobs Act (IIJA) (Public Law</u> <u>117-58, also known as the "Bipartisan</u> <u>Infrastructure Law"</u>) into law. It provides \$550 billion over fiscal years 2022 through 2026 in new Federal investment in infrastructure, including in roads, bridges, and mass transit, water infrastructure, resilience, and broadband.

The website, <u>Bipartisan Infrastructure</u> <u>Law - FHWA | Federal Highway Admin-</u> <u>istration (dot.gov)</u>, will serve as your one-stop shop for FHWA's implementation of the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law, including everything from fact sheets and funding notices to guidance, regulations, and presentations.

Fleet transition plan for public and private vehicle fleets. This group will work with public and private entities to accelerate the transition to zero- and low-emission fleet vehicles.

- **Vehicle Miles Traveled (VMT) reduction plan**. This group will explore ways to reduce the number of vehicle miles traveled in North Carolina.
- **Clean Transportation Infrastructure plan**, which will ensure that electric vehicle and alternative fuel infrastructure is sufficient to support the private and fleet transition to zero- and low-emission vehicles.
