4) Performance-Based Planning: Safety Targets Phil Conrad

INFORMATION: The federal transportation legislation requires that State DOTs and MPOs adopt performance-based planning as a component of the metropolitan transportation planning process. The NCDOT has released the next round of safety targets for North Carolina and it is up to each MPO to either adopt these targets or devise their own targets. The proposed safety targets were published on the MPO's website. No public comments were received during the comment period, which ended November 7th. Call to Order

TAC Chair Meredith Bare Smith called the September 28, 2022 meeting of the Cabarrus Rowan MPO TAC to order at approximately 6:00 pm. Chairman Smith welcomed the attendees to the meeting and asked all present to recite the Pledge of Allegiance to a flag displayed on their screens. After reciting the pledge, TAC Chair Smith called the roll of eligible voting TAC members and determined that a quorum had been met.

Chairman Smith continued on with the meeting by reading the NC State Ethics Commission Ethics Awareness and Conflict of Interest requirement and asked that should a conflict arise during any part of the meeting, members should recuse themselves from that portion of the meeting.

At this point in the meeting, CRMPO Executive Director Phil Conrad asked for any Legislative or Congressional updates from the floor. Mr. Harry Warren, NC House addressed the TAC members and reported that the House is conducting three-day sessions each month. He discussed redistricting with the group and reported that state funds for projects should be forthcoming very

soon. Representative Warren assured the TAC members that he is always available for any questions that they may have.

Director Conrad continued by introducing House of Representative Kristin Baker. NC House Representative Baker thanked the TAC members for the opportunity to attend their meeting.

Moving forward, CRMPO Director Conrad introduced Mr. Anthony Perkins, NCDOT Board Member. Mr. Perkins shared sad news with the group regarding the death of Mrs. Anna Bradshaw. Mrs. Bradshaw was an NCDOT employee who was killed on the job by a hit and run driver. Mr. Perkins also reported to the members that a Live Survey and the STIP are both on the NCDOT website. He also informed the TAC members that six RAISE Grants had been awarded on the Monday prior to this meeting. Mr. Perkins closed in stating that the NCDOT Board has two new Board members, Merrie Jo Alcoke, NCDOT Division 2 and Meagan Phillips, NCDOT Division 11.

Chair Smith then asked for any Chamber of Commerce updates. Mrs. Elaine Spaulding from the Rowan Chamber reported on upcoming events with the Rowan Chamber during the month of October and invited the TAC members to attend.

With no further Chamber reports, Chair Smith asked if there were any speakers from the floor. With none being heard she moved on to the next order of business.

TAC Chair Smith asked the members if there were any adjustments to the meeting agenda including the Consent Agenda. Director Conrad made a request to move Item 2 in the Consent Agenda to Item 3A. Without any further adjustments heard Mr. Ron Smith made a motion to approve the agenda with adjustments and Mr. Charles Seaford seconded the motion. The TAC members voted unanimously to approve. Chair Smith then requested a motion to approve the Consent Agenda. Mr. Charles Seaford made a motion to approve the Consent Agenda and Mr. Terry Crawford seconded that motion. The TAC members voted unanimously to approve.

RIDER Transit Program of Projects

RIDER Transit System has presented their annual Program of Projects list. The Program of Projects is a list of proposed FTA grant requests to support the operations of RIDER Transit System in FY 2023. RIDER Transit System has chosen to use the CRMPO Public Involvement procedures to complete this annual requirement.

FY 2020-2029 MTIP Modification #14

CRMPO Director Phil Conrad reminded the TAC members that CRMPO staff typically brings amendments or modifications from recent NCDOT Board of Transportation agendas to the TCC/TAC for consideration. The first project modification in this case is BL-0043, requesting a delay in construction to FY24 for the North Washington Street sidewalk project. The next project was to add a project break to HS-2010H or NC 49/Zion Church Road intersection project. The next project was to add a project break to HS-2012D or long life pavement markings. The next project was to add funding in FY 23 to R-5789 and R-5790 to make or upgrade intersections to ADA compliance. The next project was to add funding under the state bridge program to B-5372 or East 1st Street and Cannon Blvd. The final project was to funding under the state bridge program to B-5810 or NC 24/27 over Rocky River.

Director Conrad called members' attention to Attachment #2 which was a resolution modifying the MTIP for this project. With no questions or comments heard, Mr. Charles Seaford made a motion to endorse MTIP Modification #14. Mr. Ron Smith seconded that motion and the TAC members voted unanimously to approve.

Approval of March 23, 2022 Minutes

Chair Smith called members' attention to the minutes from the August 24, 2022 meeting included in their meeting packets Chair Smith asked if there were any corrections or additions to the minutes. With none being heard, Mr. Ryan Dayvault made the motion to approve the minutes as presented. Mr. Ron Smith seconded the motion and the TAC members followed with a unanimous vote to approve.

NCDOT Request to Segment R-5706B

CRMPO Executive Director Phil Conrad turned this item over to Mr. Stuart Basham, NCDOT Division 10. Mr. Basham reported to the members that with the release of the Draft STIP, project R-5706B, the NC 73 widening project will likely face difficulties gaining funding in the near term. Mr. Basham informed the members that NCDOT staff would like to recommend segmenting this 11-mile project into two separate projects that would be scored and programmed independently with the break point being the I-85 interchange. Mr. Basham called members' attention to Attachment #5 in their packets which was detailed information regarding the request. He reviewed the information with the members.

Stuart went on to say that NCDOT has been conducting an express design on this nine-mile corridor to come up with better cost estimates. Since this request segments the original project, it would require another project slot being added and additional local input points from the CRMPO and Division 10 office to obtain funding in a future STIP. With no questions or comments being heard, Mr. Ryan Dayvault made a motion to endorse segmenting the NC 73 widening project, R-5706///b at the I-85 interchange. Mr. Terry Crawford seconded the motion and the TAC members voted unanimously to approve.

Proposed STPBG Call for New Projects

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Director Phil Conrad reported to the TAC members that the CRMPO issued a call for new project proposals for STPBG funding. Phil continued on by stating the call ended on September 2, 2022 and a total of five projects from three different sponsors were received. Phil called members attention to Attachment #6 included in their meeting packets which was a list of the project proposals. He went on to review the projects with the members. When completed, Phil called individual sponsors to provide a short presentation on their proposals.

Mr. Phillip Graham from the City of Concord reviewed the Derita Road Widening project application with the members. Phillip called attention to the proposal letter and provided project history along with slides to explain the City's request. The City is requesting \$7,200,000 for their project.

Mr. Rob Donham with the Town of Harrisburg addressed the TAC members to review the three submittals from the Town. Mr. Donham began by stating that the Town would be withdrawing their request for the Hickory Ridge Road Sidewalk Extension project. Rob went on to review the Caldwell Road Extension Phase 1 project. The Town is requesting \$4,885,102 for the project. Rob reviewed their second project proposal which was the Highway 49 Improvements Phase 2. He stated the Town of Harrisburg is requesting \$7,341,924 to complete this project.

The final project sponsor was Mrs. Wendy Brindle from the City of Salisbury. Wendy provided a slide show presentation explaining the history of the project which was for Main Street Safety Improvements or Phase 1. These safety improvements would be made from Kerr Street to Horah Street in Salisbury. Mrs. Brindle reported that the City of Salisbury is requesting \$7,426,755 for their project.

With no questions or comments being heard following all presentations, Mr. Ryan Dayvault made a motion that the CRMPO endorses the four-highway project requests from the three project sponsors. Mr. Terry Crawford seconded that motion and the TAC members voted unanimously to approve.

Funding Swap Request

Director Conrad reported to the members that NCDOT is proposing the swapping of funding sources for several projects with the CRMPO. By doing this, it could possibly help NCDOT to secure additional federal funding for North Carolina. David Wasserman explained the funding swap would require switching \$12 million of CRMPO's Surface Transportation Block Grant Direct Attributable (STBG-DA) federal funds for \$12 million in other flexible federal funds in the years the STBG-DA funds were programmed. David went on to state that this swap would have no impact on schedules, local matches, or project management requirements. Phil mentioned Attachment #7 which was a memo from NCDOT staff explaining the request and proposed swap.

After all review and no questions, Mr. Charles Seaford made a motion to endorse the request from NCDOT to swap funds as proposed. Chairman Smith seconded that motion and the TAC members voted unanimously to approve.

FY 2022-2023 UPWP Amendment #1

CRMPO Director Phil Conrad reported to the TAC members that the CRMPO currently has Special Studies funds that have not been allocated to any project. Phil informed the TAC members that the Town of China Grove would like to request \$48,000 in Special Studies funds for a corridor study of NC 152 East. Phil went on to say that the Town would be responsible for the remaining twenty (20) percent local match for their proposed project.

Director Conrad called members' attention to Attachment #8 which was a Draft resolution to amend the UPWP and increase the line item for Special Studies by \$48,000. Phil reviewed the resolution with the members. With no questions or discussion, Chairman Smith made a motion to adopt amendment #1 to the FY 2022-2023 UPWP. Mr. Ryan Dayvault seconded that motion and the TAC members voted unanimously to approve.

Reports/CRMPO Business

- Local Reports NCDOT Division 9 & 10 Mr. Pat Ivey, NCDOT Division 9 informed the TAC members that Division 9 Updates were included in their meeting packet. Mr. Ivey reviewed a few of the projects.
 - Mr. Brett Canipe, NCDOT Division 10 representative called TAC members' attention to a spreadsheet of Division 10 project updates. He reviewed some of the projects in Division 10.
- 2. Salem Parkway Public Involvement Director Conrad reported that this item will be rescheduled to a future meeting due to time restraints.
- 3. Rowan Transit System section 5310 Grant Application Letter of Support Executive Director Phil Conrad called members' attention to page 96 in their packets to review the request. After review, Ms. Tamara Sheffield made a motion to support the request from Rowan County and Mrs. Barbara Strang seconded the motion. The TAC members voted unanimously to approve.
- 4. Special Studies Update Director Conrad reported that both the Rowan County and Town of China Grove special studies projects are moving forward.
- 5. TAP Fund Project Call Director Conrad informed the TAC members that November 30, 2022 is the deadline for submitting Bike and Ped Project requests. He stated that approximately \$4 million is available.

Background

The annual Program of Projects is a list of projects proposed to be funded in a given fiscal year from Federal Transit Formula Grants, any transit discretionary grants, any Federal Highway Funds flexed to FTA for transit improvements, and state formula grant programs. Such projects must also be identified in the MPO-approved Metropolitan Transportation Improvement Program or the Unified Planning Work Program to be eligible for inclusion in the Program of Projects. The Program of Projects provides an additional opportunity for the public to learn about and comment on planned transit grants for the fiscal year.

The Program of Projects may be developed and approved by the designated recipient (the City of Concord - Rider Transit System) or the Metropolitan Planning Organization. The MPO is responsible for the MTIP and the UPWP, and therefore, Rider Transit has elected to use the MPO's public comment process for its program of projects. There are multiple recipients of Federal Transit grants operating in the MPO area (Salisbury Transit and NCDOT for Cabarrus County and Rowan County). The MPO must follow the Public Participation Plan, which for the Program of Projects requires a 28-day public comment period.

FY 2023 Program of Projects

The FY 2023 Program of Projects includes anticipated FTA formula grants under the following programs: Section 5303 Metropolitan Planning, Section 5307 Urbanized Formula, Section 5310 Enhanced Mobility of Seniors and Individuals with Disabilities, and Section 5339 Bus and Bus Facilities.

The FY 2023 Program of Projects also includes State Maintenance Assistance Program (SMAP) funds administered by NCDOT.

The Program of Projects also describes funds made available to subrecipients and grant details such as a description, federal funding amount, and matching funds amounts. The proposed program as identified in the Draft Program of Projects will be the final program unless amended.

The MPO will seek public input on the Program of Projects under the MPO Public Participation Program. This includes a 28-day public comment period and a public review to be held at the November 30 TAC meeting. The Transportation Advisory Committee will be the body to approve the document.

Recommended Action: MPO Approval at the November 30 meeting.

Section 5307 Urbanized Area Formula Grants - FY 2023

TG-5103C Preventive Maintenance: Contracted Maintenance Capital Costs

The City of Concord will apply for Federal capital assistance to support the costs associated with using a third-party contractor to provide transit services. Rider Transit provides the vehicles, but the third party contractor provides drivers and maintenance staff necessary to provide public transportation services in the City of Concord. Under FTA rules this is counted as preventive maintenance. Eligible expenses are eligible for up to 80% federal reimbursement. Eligible expenses are capped at no more than 40% of overall third party contractor costs. The proposed grant amount falls under the 40% maximum threshold.

WHEREAS, the operating and capital projects listed in the Program of Projects must be consistent with the Metropolitan Transportation Improvement Program and planning projects must be consistent with the Unified Planning Work Program; AND

WHEREAS, MPO area transit agencies, including the designated recipient City of Concord -- Rider Transit System, as well as the NCDOT will apply for and receive grants from the Federal Transit Administration consistent with the Program of Projects; AND

WHEREAS, the MPO and the City of Concord comply with and will ensure compliance to the provisions of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964; AND

WHEREAS, the MPO hereby assures and certifies compliance with the Federal Statutes, regulations, executive orders, the Section 5333(b) Labor Protection requirements, and all administrative requirements which relate to the applications made to and grants received from the Federal Transit Administration; AND

WHEREAS, on August 31, 2020 the Federal Highway Administration and the Federal Transit Administration jointly certified that the MPO substantially meets the federal metropolitan transportation planning requirements, for a period of four years;

Endorsement of Targets for Safety Performance Measures Established By NCDOT

WHEREAS, the Cabarrus-Rowan MPO has been designated by the Governor of the State of North Carolina as the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) responsible, together with the State, for the comprehensive, continuing, and cooperative transportation planning process for the MPO's metropolitan planning area; and;

WHEREAS the Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) final rule (23 CFR Part 490) requires States to set targets for five safety performance measures by August 31, 2022, and;

WHEREAS, the North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT) has established targets for five performance measures based on five year rolling averages for: (1) Number of Fatalities, {2) Rate of Fatalities per 100 million Vehicle Miles Traveled (VMT), (3) Number of Serious Injuries, (4) Rate of Serious Injuries per 100 million VMT, and (5) Number of Non-Motorized {bicycle and pedestrian} Fatalities and Non-motorized Serious Injuries, and;

WHEREAS, the NCDOT coordinated the establishment of safety targets with the 19 Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs) in North Carolina through a Safety Target Setting Coordination Training Workshop held in March, 2017, and;

WHEREAS, the NCDOT has officially established and reported the safety targets in the Highway Safety Improvement Program annual report dated August 31, 2022, and;

WHEREAS the MPO's may establish safety targets by agreeing to plan and program projects that contribute toward the accomplishment of the State's targets for each measure, or establish its own target within 180 days of the State establishing and reporting its safety targets in the HSIP annual report.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Cabarrus-Rowan MPO Transportation Advisory Committee (TAC) agrees to plan and program projects that contribute toward the accomplishment of the State's targets as noted below for each of the aforementioned performance measures:

- For the 2023 Highway Safety Improvement Plan (HSIP), the goal is to reduce total fatalities by 19.57 percent each year from 1,494.8 (2017-2021 average) to 1,202.2 (2019-2023 average) by December 31, 2023.
- For the 2023 Highway Safety Improvement Plan (HSIP), the goal is to reduce the fatality rate by 20.95 percent from 1.279 (2017-2021 average) to 1.011 (2019-2023 average) by December 31, 2023.
- For the 2023 Highway Safety Improvement Plan (HSIP), the goal is to reduce total serious injuries by 30.19 percent from 4,903.4 (2017-2021 average) to 3,423.0 (2019-2023 average) by December 31, 2023.
- For the 2023 Highway Safety Improvement Plan (HSIP), the goal is to reduce the serious injury rate by 31.75 percent from 4.195 (2017-2021 average) to 2.863 (2019-2023 average) by December 31, 2023.
- For the 2023 Highway Safety Improvement Plan (HSIP), the goal is to reduce the total non-motorized fatalities and serious injuries by 26.52 percent from 637.2 (2017-2021 average) to 468.2 (2019-2023 average) by December 31, 2023.






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









Non-Motorized Fatal and Serious Injuries by Year (2012 - 2021)

SUBJECT: Safety Performance Measures – FHWA Assessment and 2023 Targets

Background

Effective April 14, 2016, the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) established five highway safety performance measures in accord with regulations set forth in the Federal MAP-21 and FAST Act transportation funding bills. These performance measures are:

- Number of fatalities;
- 2. Rate of fatalities per 100 million vehicle miles traveled;
- 3. Number of serious injuries;
- 4. Rate of serious injuries per 100 million vehicle miles traveled; and
- 5. Number of combined non-motorized fatalities and non-motorized serious injuries.

These targets are established annually, are based on 5 year rolling averages, and are for calendar years. North Carolina state targets are set in agreement with our Strategic Highway Safety Plan (SHSP) goals. The SHSP goals are developed through collaborative efforts of a diverse group of stakeholders including state, regional, and local partners (including MPOs). The goal of the most recent (2019) SHSP is to reduce fatalities and serious injuries by half by 2035, moving towards zero by 2050.

North Carolina Safety Performance Target Achievement Determination

Earlier this year, FHWA completed an assessment of target achievement for NCDOT's calendar year (CY) 2020 safety targets, based on the 5-year averages for 2016-2020 for each measure. As per 23 CFR 490.211(c)(2), a State Department of Transportation (DOT) has met or made significant progress towards meeting its safety performance targets when at least four of the safety performance targets established under 23 CFR 490.209(a) have been met or the actual outcome

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is better than the baseline performance. **Based on FHWA's review, North Carolina has not met or made significant progress toward achieving its safety performance targets.** As a result, NCDOT must ensure that all HSIP safety funds are obligated, and must develop an HSIP Implementation Plan that describes actions the State will take to meet or make significant progress toward achieving its targets. Table 1 below provides a summary of the target achievement determination at the state level.

Next Steps

MPOs are not directly assessed by FHWA on their progress towards meeting safety performance targets. However, coordination and deliberate action will be needed to achieve the goals outlined in the NC Strategic Highway Safety Plan and as communicated through the safety performance targets. We encourage additional coordination between MPO's and NCDOT Traffic Safety Unit in all areas of safety, but specifically in data sharing, safety tools development, safety need identification and shared safety project implementation. The Traffic Safety Unit is available to meet with your MPO for additional discussion and partnership.

FHWA guidance allows each MPO to establish safety performance targets by either agreeing to plan and program projects so that they contribute toward the accomplishments of the State DOT performance targets or committing to quantifiable HSIP targets for their specific MPO area. If an MPO establishes its own targets, it will need to do so in coordination with the State per FHWA guidelines. The Traffic Safety Unit is available to facilitate this coordination. As a reminder, MPOs must establish safety performance targets no later than February 27 of each year per FHWA guidance. Please transmit a signed adoption resolution indicating the establishment of safety targets for your MPO or supporting the state's targets to Daryl Vreeland (dvreeland@ncdot.gov) in the Transportation Planning Division just as you have in previous years. 



FY 2023 RAISE Grant Project Candidate Survey

Next month the USDOT will release the Initial Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) for the 2023 RAISE Grants. The Final Notice of Funding Opportunity should be available on or before November 30th. The Integrated Mobility Division (IMD) is actively exploring projects that may be strong candidates for RAISE.

IMD is seeking your assistance in identifying potential projects, programs of projects or combined projects that meet the eligibility criteria for the USDOT RAISE grants. Please review the following considerations and submit potential candidate projects that meet some or all of these conditions, by **Friday November 11, 2022**, via the following Smartsheet survey: FY 2023 RAISE Grant Project Candidate Survey

IMD is seeking multimodal projects that improve equitable connections to transit and bicycle & pedestrian facilities. Overall selection criteria for RAISE grants include safety, environmental sustainability, quality of life, economic competitiveness, and state of good repair. The secondary selection criteria includes partnerships and innovation. Projects should include components that reduce emissions, promote energy efficiency, increase resiliency, and recycle or redevelop existing infrastructure.

When completing the survey, be sure to attach supporting documents for projects (RAISE applications if you submitted an application in the past, BCA, plans/drawings, letter of support, etc.) Funding sources should be identified for the project. NCDOT may be able to provide match for transit components or complete streets components that are already committed in the STIP. Local match (non-Federal and non-state) would be required for independent bicycle & pedestrian projects.

Projects can be combined into a program of projects, potentially covering a broader region, as long as each project has independent utility.

North Carolina's plan will use NEVI program formula funding in a cost-efficient way that creates a reliable and accessible public EV charging network. The plan will be carried out in two phases:

Phase 1 is focused on the build out of NEVI-compliant stations along the approved AFCs in North Carolina to provide reliable regional and interstate electric vehicle travel across the state. **Phase 2** will be focused on community-based public electric vehicle charging or other critical infrastructure needs.

NCDOT began initiating Phase 1 of the plan in October 2022 while also commencing foundational public engagement work for Phase 2. The team will work with market participants and community stakeholders to ensure the charging infrastructure is deployed in an equitable, resilient, and sustainable way.
