3) FY 2024-2033 MTIP Modification #9

INFORMATION: MPO staff typically brings amendments or modifications from recent NCDOT Board of Transportation agendas to the TCC/TAC for consideration. The first project modification is to add operating funds beginning in FY 25 to train 74/75 in the Piedmont Corridor (P-2918). The second project modification is to add utilities in FY 25 for the Dale Earnhardt Blvd intersection project (U-5761). The third project modification is to add utilities in FY 25 to the Derita Road widening (U-6032). The fourth and final project is to delay right-of-way to FY 26 for the Caldwell Road extension (HL-0063). Attachment 3 is a resolution modifying the MTIP for these projects. The new STIP was effective October 1, 2023.

4) FY 2025-2026 UPWP

Phil Conrad

INFORMATION: Each year the Cabarrus-Rowan MPO develops and adopts a unified planning work program (UPWP). The UPWP is the MPO budget and follows the state fiscal year 2025-2026 and is included as attachment 4A. The UPWP identifies the planning tasks, responsible agencies, and funding sources for regional transportation planning activities to be conducted within the planning area during the next fiscal year. These projects include MPO planning activities undertaken by local agencies, the N.C. Department of Transportation, and a line

item for Regional Model and MTP Maintenance. In the fall of 2024, the NCDOT indicated that the allocation in FY 26 to the MPO is \$489,250. There is no more unobligated balance for PL funds to MPO's in NC. As part of the UPWP, the Federal government is requiring all MPO's to certify their transportation planning process on an annual basis. Attachment 4B is a checklist for the CR MPO to certify the MPO transportation planning process. The local match table is included as attachment 4C and the resolution adopting the UPWP is included as attachment 4D.

ACTION/RECOMMENDATION: 1) Receive a report on the FY 2025-2026 UPWP; 2) Discuss; and 3) Recommend that the TAC consider certifying the CR MPO transportation planning process and consider adopting the FY 2025-2026 UPWP.

5) 2055 MTP DRAFT Projects List Revisions

<u>INFORMATION:</u> Since the anticipated release of the 2026-2035 TIP, MPO staff began working on a draft revenue forecast for the 2055 Transportation Plan. This forecast is based on the tier system included in the Strategic Mobility Formula, and statewide forecast methodology developed by NCDOT for regional and division tier allocations. These forecasts are applied to the projects listed in the 2050 Plan and most recent MPO SPOT/Priority List. The Draft 2055 Projects List is included as attachment 5. In addition, the MPO is requested to confirm recommendations from the last Cabarrus County Public Transportation Master Plan, with the recent endorsement of the Transit Commission in February.

Mrs. Susie Morris, the new TCC Chairman for 2025, called the January 15, 2025 meeting of the Cabarrus Rowan MPO TCC to order. TCC Chairman Morris called the roll of eligible TCC members and determined that a quorum had been met. TCC Chair Morris then asked if there were any adjustments to the meeting agenda. With none heard, she asked if there were any speakers from the floor. With no speakers being heard, TCC Chair Morris moved to the next item of business.

Approval of Minutes

TCC Chairman Morris called the members' attention to the minutes of the October 16, 2024 TCC meeting included in their packets. Chairman Morris asked if there were any corrections or additions to the minutes. With no corrections or additions heard, Mrs. Wendy Brindle made a motion to accept the minutes as presented Mr. Ed Muire seconded that motion and the TCC members voted unanimously to approve.

Nomination and Election of TCC Vice Chair

CRMPO Executive Director Phil Conrad addressed the TCC members and reminded them that the bylaws of the CRMPO TCC requires that every year in January a new Vice Chairman must be elected. He went on to say that the newly elected Vice Chair will rotate to the Chair position automatically beginning 2026. Also according to the by-laws the TCC Chair and Vice Chair must be rotated between jurisdictions in Cabarrus and Rowan Counties. Since the new Chair is from Cabarrus County, a Vice Chair from Rowan County would need to be elected today.

With little discussion, Mr. Jason Hord nominated Mr. Michael Ambrose as the Vice Chair for 2025. With no other nominations being heard, Mr. Tony Tagliaferria made a motion to close the nominations and elect Mr. Michael Ambrose as CRMPO TCC Vice Chair. Mrs. Wendy Brindle seconded that motion and the TCC members voted unanimously to approve.

FY 2024-2033 MTIP Modification #8

Mrs. Wendy Miller, CRMPO Staff Planner, reported to the TCC members that the CRMPO staff regularly brings amendments or modifications from recent NCDOT Board of Transportation agendas to the TCC/TAC for consideration. Mrs. Miller reported that the first project modifications are statewide project additions: R5753, BO-2024, HN-0037, HO-0024, M-0531DIV, M-0531REG, M-0531SW, TA6665, TC-0008, TC-0010, TC-0018, TC-0021, TM-0023, TM-0027, TM-0028, TM-0029, TM-0031, TM-0032, TO-0004, TQ-6954, and TU-0011. The second project modification is the delay of construction to FY 26 for the sidewalk project in Granite Quarry (BL-0088). The third project modification is to delay construction to FY 25 for the Brenner Avenue intersection project (C-5603H). The fourth project modification is to modify funding in FY 25 for the Little Texas Road sidewalk (EB-5844). The fifth project is to remove the Jake Alexander Boulevard sidewalk project (BL-0034). The sixth project is to add the George Liles Pkwy interchange lighting project (HL-0157). The seventh project is to delay preliminary engineering to FY 25 for the Concord Signal System Upgrade (HL0123). The eighth project is to delay construction to FY 26 for the Salisbury Train Station and pedestrian underpass (P-5726A). The ninth project is delay right-of way to FY 25 Salisbury Train Station waiting space expansion (P-5733). The tenth and final project is to reflect the cost increase by \$2 million and the 25 percent threshold for the NC 73 widening west of the county line (R-5706A). Attachment 4 is a resolution modifying the MTIP for these projects. The new STIP was effective October 1, 2023.

With little discussion or comments, Mr. Tony Tagliaferria made a motion to recommend that the CRMPO TAC consider endorsing modification #8 to the FY 2024-2033 MTIP. Mr. Jason Hord seconded that motion and the TCC members voted unanimously to approve.

PERFORMANCE-BASED PLANNING: SAFETY TARGETS

Mr. Brian Murphy with NCDOT Traffic Safety Systems reported to the TCC members that federal transportation legislation requires that State DOTs and MPOs adopt performance-based planning as a component of the metropolitan transportation planning process. He explained that NCDOT has released the next round of safety targets for North Carolina, and it is up to each MPO to either adopt these targets or devise their own targets and is an annual requirement. Mr. Murphy provided the TCC members with a power point presentation to explain the safety issues on NC

roadways including those in Cabarrus and Rowan counties. He discussed traffic safety data and how NCDOT is trying to lower the risks on these roadways. He answered questions from the TCC members.

Director Phil Conrad thanked Mr. Murphy after his presentation and reported to the members that the proposed safety targets were published on the CRMPO's website and advertised for public comment. He called members' attention to Attachment 5 which was a draft resolution in support of the new safety targets for 2025.

With no further questions or discussion, Mr. Ed Muire made a motion to recommend that the CRMPO TAC consider endorsing the Safety Targets as presented. Mrs. Erin Burris seconded the motion and the TCC members voted unanimously to approve.

FY 2025-2026 Draft UPWP

Director Conrad reminded the TCC members that each year the Cabarrus-Rowan MPO develops and adopts a unified planning work program (UPWP). The UPWP is the CRMPO budget and follows the state fiscal year 2025-2026. The UPWP he explained identifies the planning tasks, responsible agencies, and funding sources for regional transportation planning activities to be conducted within the planning area during the next fiscal year. These projects include CRMPO planning activities undertaken by local agencies, the N.C. Department of Transportation, and a line item for Regional Model and MTP Maintenance. In the fall of 2024, the NCDOT indicated that the allocation in FY 26 to the CRMPO is \$489,250.

Director Conrad then called members' attention to Attachment 6 in their packets which was a draft of the upcoming UPWP. Director Conrad explained the budget line item by line item for the TCC members. With no questions or comments, Director Conrad closed by stating that this item is for informational purposes today and it will come before them again at a future meeting.

FY 2024-2025 UPWP Amendment #1

Director Conrad informed the TCC members that CRMPO currently has some special study funds that have not been assigned. He continued by stating the CRMPO staff would like to request \$48,000 in special study funds for technical assistance for the 2055 MTP/CTP Update as was presented in the fall of 2024. He explained that the local match (\$12,000) has already been budgeted for FY 2024-25. The resolution he explained is to amend the FY 2024-2025 UPWP and reallocate funds to the line item for "Special Studies" (II-B-3) by \$48,000. He directed the TCC members to Attachment 7 included in their packets for their review. Director Conrad informed members that the firm WSP would be assisting with the additional work.

With no discussion or questions being heard, Mr. Ed Muire made a motion to adopt amendment #1 to the FY2024-2025 UPWP. Mr. Franklin Gover seconded the motion and the TCC members voted unanimously to approve.

2055 MTP Draft Projects List

Director Conrad reported to the TCC members that since the anticipated release of the 2026-2035 TIP, CRMPO staff began working on a draft revenue forecast for the 2055 Transportation Plan. This forecast is based on the tier system included in the Strategic Mobility Formula, and

statewide forecast methodology developed by NCDOT for regional and division tier allocations. He went on to state that these forecasts are applied to the projects listed in the 2050 Plan and most recent MPO SPOT/Priority List. He then called members' attention to a Draft 2055 Projects List included as Attachment #8 in their meeting packets. Director Conrad then provided the TCC members with a power point presentation which explained the projects and subsequent horizon year schedules on the list and the draft financial assumptions.

Director Conrad also reported that the CRMPO is requested to confirm recommendations from the last Cabarrus County Public Transportation Master Plan, pending endorsement of the CK Rider Transit Commission.

With no further information presented or questions heard, Mr. Ed Muire made a motion to recommend that the CRMPO TAC consider releasing the 2055 Projects List and financial assumptions for public comment. Mr. Jason Hord seconded that motion and the TCC members voted unanimously to approve.

Reports/CRMPO Business

<u>1. Local Reports</u> – **MPO/NCDOT Division 9 and 10/TPD** - Mr. Fred Haith, NCDOT Division 9 representative highlighted the updated Division 9 project spreadsheet which was included in the meeting packet. He reported that some ADA upgrades are in process.

Mr. Theo Ghitea, NCDOT Division 10 representative reviewed the spreadsheet of Division 10 project updates and noted some of the ongoing projects in Division 10.

Director Conrad referenced a letter from Federal Highway Administration with some updates.

- **2. 2020 Census Smoothed Planning Boundary** Mrs. Emily Stupka reported on the planning boundary and called members' attention to a map included in their packets for review.
- 3. RAISE Grant Letters of Support Division 10 and Town of East Spencer—Director Conrad highlighted two separate letters in their packets. One from Division 10 and one from the Town of East Spencer asking for letters of support for their respective project applications to the federal government. After reviewing the projects and letters, Mr. Ed Muire made a motion to recommend that the CRMPO TAC consider endorsing these projects with letters of support. Mr. Fred Haith seconded that motion and the TCC members voted unanimously to approve.
- **4.** <u>Intercity Passenger Rail Grant Program Letter of Support Mr.</u> Devon Huston with the Town of Harrisburg reported to the TCC members' that the Town of Harrisburg is applying for grant funding for a Rail Station in the Saddle Creek area of Harrisburg. He is requesting a letter of support for the Town's application. With no questions or comments, Mr. Ed Muire made a motion to recommend that the CRMPO TAC consider endorsing the Town's application by providing them with a letter of support from the CRMPO. Mr. Fred Haith seconded the motion and members voted unanimously to approve.
- **<u>5. P8.0 Project Call</u>** Director Conrad reported that P7.0 carryover projects are due by May 30^{th} .

- **6. Bike and Ped Demonstration Planning Studies** Director Phil Conrad reported to the members that the Bike and Ped Demonstration Studies are in draft format and nearing completion. Information was included in the TCC meeting packet.
- **7. Special Study Update** Mr. Franklin Gover reported to members that the Town of China Grove's study is finished and should be approved at the February meeting of their Town Council.
- **8. CMAQ Priority Submittal and Funding Awards** Mrs. Erin Burris with the Town of Mt. Pleasant provided an update on the Town's administrative efforts to get their sidewalk projects started.

RESOLUTION ADOPTING MODIFICATION #9 TO THE CABARRUS-ROWAN METROPOLITAN TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM FOR FY 2024-2033

WHEREAS, the Metropolitan Transportation Improvement Program (MTIP) is a staged multiple year listing of all federally funded transportation projects scheduled for implementation within the Cabarrus-Rowan Urban Area which have been selected from a priority list of projects; and

WHEREAS, the document provides the mechanism for official endorsement of the program of projects by the Transportation Advisory Committee (TAC); and

WHEREAS, the Transportation Advisory Committee has reviewed the current FY 2024-2033 Transportation Improvement Program, dated October 1, 2023, and found the need to modify it;

WHEREAS, the following attached modification has been proposed.

WHEREAS, Projects listed in the MTIP are also included in the State TIP (STIP) and balanced against anticipated revenues as identified in the STIP; and

WHEREAS, the Metropolitan Transportation Plan has a planning horizon year of 2050, and meets all the requirements in 23 CFR 450; and

WHEREAS, the Transportation Advisory Committee has found that the Transportation Improvement Program conforms to the purpose of the North Carolina State Implementation Plan (or interim emissions tests in areas where no SIP is approved or found adequate) for maintaining the National Ambient Air Quality Standards in accordance with 40 CFR 51 & 93; and

WHEREAS, the Transportation Advisory Committee has determined that the proposed modification is exempt from the requirements for determining air quality conformity in accordance with 40 CFR 93.127.

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Cabarrus-Rowan Urban Area Transportation Advisory Committee that the FY 2024-2033 Metropolitan Transportation Improvement Program dated October 1, 2023, for the Cabarrus Rowan Urban Area Metropolitan Planning Organization be modified as listed above on this the 26th day of March, 2025.

II-A Data and Planning Support

This section covers data and processes used to support transportation planning related to transportation infrastructure.

Programmed Amount: \$45250 9% of staff budget

II-A-1 Networks and Support Systems Total: \$ 10000

- The Cabarrus-Rowan MPO will create and maintain spatial data for the MPO planning area.
- Provide the public and MPO members with traffic count data from the NCDOT traffic count program.
- The Cabarrus-Rowan MPO will update GIS data for fixed routes, deviated fixed routes, service areas, and ridership for transit providers in the region.
- Maintain a GIS inventory of existing data from local, state, and federal partners related to bicycle and pedestrian transportation facilities. Continue to update sidewalk, greenways and bicycle facility data based on data available from local partners.
- Develop online mapping for displaying 2055 MTP, socioeconomic data, and other NCDOT-generated GIS layers.

II-A-2 Travelers and Behavior Total: \$ 16592

- The Cabarrus-Rowan MPO will maintain an inventory of building permit data to generate a base year update and report land use changes by Transportation Analysis Zone on an annual basis.
- · CRMPO staff will update the major employer data (part of InfoUSA database) that was recently used in the Metrolina Regional Model.

II-A-3 Transportation Modeling Total: \$ 18658

- CRMPO will provide the CR MPO portion of the Model Custodian staff-generated expenses for the Metrolina Regional Travel Model Maintenance.

II-B Planning Process

Tasks within this category are related to the development of the MPO Metropolitan Transportation Plan and Comprehensive Transportation Plan. Federal regulations require each MPO to have a fiscally-constrained long range transportation plan looking out at least 20 years. The plan must be updated every four years. The MPO also participates in the development of the Comprehensive Transportation Plan. The plan is developed jointly with NCDOT and reflects the vision and long term needs of the transportation system. In addition, the MPO is responsible for a number of ongoing long-range planning activities such as corridor studies, congestion management monitoring and air quality planning.

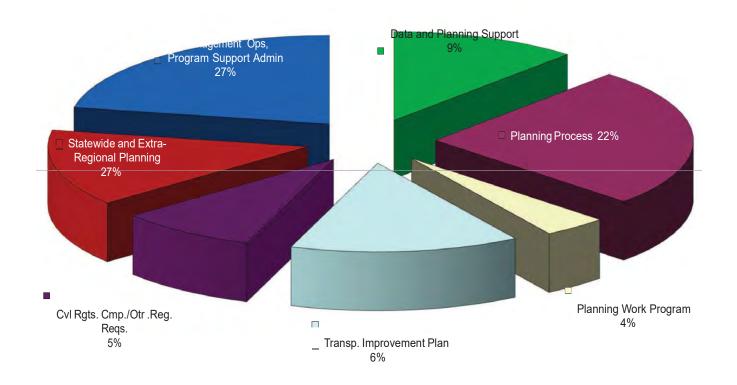

Introduction

- Section 134 of Title 23 U.S.C., section 8 of the Federal Transit Act (49 U.S.C. app. 1607); and
- Section 174 and 176 (c) and (d) of the Clean Air Act (42 U.S.C. 7504, 7506 (c) and (d)); and
- Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and Title VI assurance executed by each state under 23 U.S.C. 324 and 29 U.S.C. 794; and
- Section 103 (b) of the Intermodal Surface Transportation Efficiency Act of 1991 (ISTEA) (Public Law 102-240) regarding the involvement of disadvantaged business enterprises (DBE) in the FHWA and FTA funded planning projects; and
- The provisions of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (ADA) (Public Law 101-136) 104 Stat. 327, as amended and U.S. DOT regulations "Transportation for Individuals with Disabilities" (49 CFR parts 27, 37, and 38).

SUBJECT: DRAFT STIP Programming Adjustments and 2055 MTP Financial

Plan

The purpose of this memo is to provide additional information on the recent STIP Programming and its impact on project schedules and financial forecasts for the 2055 MTP Update and Projects List. Due to the lagging impact of COVID-19 and ongoing reduced gas tax revenue to the state, NCDOT continues to struggle with project schedules. In addition, the NCDOT released the 10 year estimates for each of the tiers which is broken out by Division and Region. The Cabarrus-Rowan MPO is included in Divisions 9 and 10 and Regions D and E. According to these estimates, Division 9 and 10 will each receive about \$702 million over the 10 year period for division tier projects. Because the regional tier is indexed for population, Region D will receive about \$1.6 billion over the 10 year period and Regional E will receive about \$2.1 billion over the 10 year period for regional tier projects. The 2 regions total 10 counties or 10 percent of the geography of the state of North Carolina, but almost 28 percent of the population.

NCDOT made several schedule adjustments to projects in the 2050 MTP, which will redefine the core of the 2055 MTP, particularly some project schedules thru the year 2045. It's safe to assume that lingering impacts of the year 2020 will continue to be felt for some time. In addition, the NCDOT has completed a statewide 2050 Moves Plan. This Plan included revenue assumptions based on a number of scenarios generated without the full benefit of knowing the fiscal impacts of the year 2020. However, it may be prudent to retain these forecasts over the duration of the 2055 MTP for a number of reasons. At some point, the impacts of 2020 will reverse course unless there are a series of global pandemics or changes in driving culture. Second, the life of the 2055 MTP is only 4 years, so additional information will be forthcoming by the time the next update is due in 2030, first one in the next decade. Third, the statewide 2050 Plan includes a trend scenario that conservatively forecasts the future based on past results, which is an acceptable practice. Without a crystal ball, it is difficult to predict variables such as pandemics, natural disasters, fuel efficiency, driverless cars, etc. and their impact on such a small geography as the MPO much less a nation's transportation system. These factors will be evaluated and debated for many iterations before the end of calendar 2055, with multiple chances for adjustment by the state and MPO. Incidentally, the MPO will assume that Strategic Transportation Investments (STI) will remain intact for the life of the 2055 MTP, which may be optimistic. The system has proven to be predictable and valuable to the transportation planning and project development profession.

Using the NCDOT 2050 Moves Plan and updated STIP revenue forecasts for the years 2035 thru 2055 would translate into about \$458 million in Division Tier revenue for the MPO area and about \$707 million in Regional Tier revenue for the MPO area. While

applying this revenue to the final two horizon years (2045 and 2055). The following noteworthy projects should be completed by 2045: the widening of NC 73, the George Liles extension, and widening a western section of NC 73 in Cabarrus County, as well as the Airport Pkwy extension, widening of NC 150, and the McCanless Road interchange in Rowan County. All of these projects have been part of the MPO planning process and previous MTP's for a few years. Due to limited revenue in the last 10 years of the MTP, a couple of projects would be open for traffic by 2055: the US 52 bypass and widening the final sections of Poplar Tent Road and NC 73. It does not mean that these projects could not slip into the next MTP or open sooner due to many, many factors over the next 30 years. In addition, many non-highway projects will be planned and completed over this horizon. The MPO receives CMAQ, CRP, TAP, and STBGP funds that can be directly applied to these needs. There are currently 17 active discretionary projects in the MPO area ranging from \$492,000 to \$15 million. The NCDOT currently has a minimum floor for highway expenditures in the 90 percent range, with the remainder pledged for non-highway projects. Non-highway projects also compete for state match funds thru STI such as transit and aviation projects. Additional discussion of non-highway projects and revenue assumptions particularly for public transit will be covered under a separate memo.

SUBJECT: 2055 MTP Financial Plan: Transit

The purpose of this memo is to provide the details for non-highway capital expenditure as part of the 2055 MTP and specifically route and service expansions for Rider Transit. The MPO has always documented conventional transit revenue sources such as the vehicle license fees collected by Concord, Kannapolis, Salisbury, and now Town of Landis, as well as the federal programs like Section 5307, 5339, 5310, 5311, RGP, SMAP, and EDTAP. Although these are a sizable collection of state and federal resources, the need for transit expansion in the rapidly growing Concord and Kannapolis areas have led to the cities and Cabarrus County embarking on the first county-wide Long Range Public Transportation Master Plan (LRPTM). This Plan includes additional service, increased frequency, service on-demand with the demand response zones, and other recommendations as noted in Appendix F of the LRPTM Plan and also summarized in Table 1. The CK Rider Transit Commission will be embarking on a new LRPTM Plan in calendar 2025. In the interim, the Commission endorsed the financial assumptions for the purposes of the 2055 MTP Update, and will be requesting the new LRPTM be folded into the next MTP Update due in 2030. For the purposes of the 2055 MTP Update, the route recommendations for 2025 will be moved to 2030 along with the projected 1 cent sales tax revenue, pending a countywide referendum. The 20 year horizon still fits within the timeframe of the 2055 MTP Update, so there are no projects/routes planned outside of the last horizon year of the 2055 MTP. (The financial element of the LRPTM Plan can be found in Appendix G not included with this memo).

Transit Investment Summary

The Master Plan includes six phases covering 20 years and does not include projected costs for High Capacity Transit. The total capital investment includes the addition of new transit vehicles (Fixed Route and Demand Response) over the life of the plan; replacement vehicles, bus amenities, technologies, software and data, a new administrative and maintenance facility, several feasibility studies required during the life of the plan, 3 new transit hubs in Cabarrus County, and park-and-ride facilities.

The High Capacity Transit option(s) are estimated to cost between \$1.5 billion - \$4 billion dollars to implement according to the LRPTM. They will need distinct, separate funding mechanisms from those outlined above in order to build and operate. Local governments have access to local and federal government strategies and financing mechanisms for major capital projects of this magnitude. Among the most common are 5309 Capital Investment Grants, federal BUILD Grants, Transit Oriented Development, Value Capture, and Public Private Partnerships, Transportation Infrastructure Finance and Innovation Act (TIFIA) and Railroad Rehabilitation and Improvement Financing (RRIF) credits. These options will need exploration in order to fill the gap.

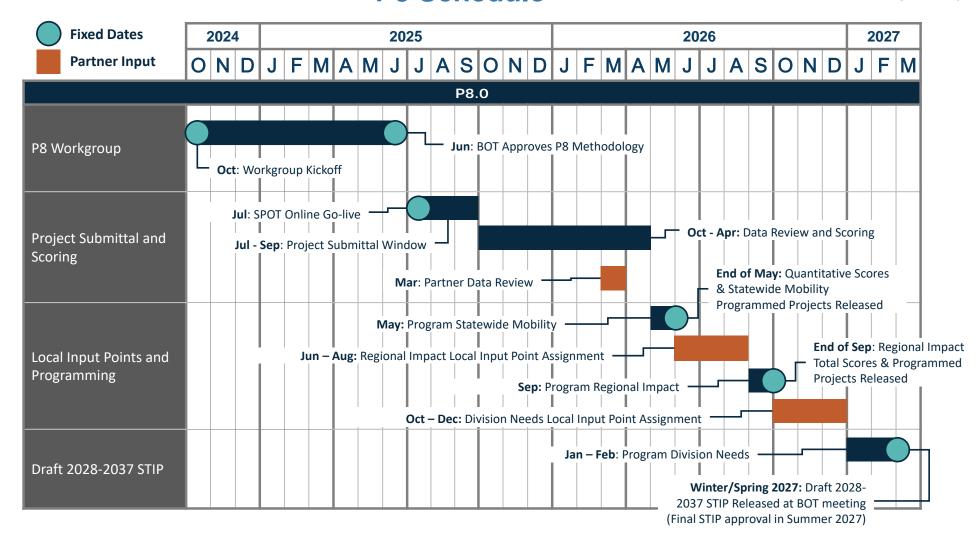

Current Condition

The intersection of Main Street and Depot Street marks the center of Downtown Cleveland. The intersection is surrounded primarily by small downtown shops and homes, mostly lining Main Street.

Main Street is lined with unmarked on-street parking on the south side in front of the post office and other shops. Because the parking is not marked, the eastbound side of Main Street is over 18 feet wide approaching the intersection. This can lead to drivers speeding through the downtown. Depot Street also appears to have unmarked on-street parking.

Sidewalks do exist along Main Street and South Depot Street, and the Town has been working to improve them. However, unimproved portions are narrow and in poor condition. In addition, the crossing at Main Street and Depot Street is currently unmarked. Cleveland recently added ADA curb ramps where sidewalks meet the intersection; however, three of four ramps are only positioned for people crossing Depot Street, with no provisions for safely crossing Main Street. The sidewalks on the north side of Main Street also do not line up with each other, forcing an indirect diagonal crossing.

Recommendations

The Main Street and Depot Street crossing should be striped with high visibility markings on all four sides of the intersection, with the northwest, northeast, and southeast curb ramps updated to ADA standards. The northern crossing should be realigned by reconstructing the northeast corner. Unimproved sidewalks surrounding the intersection should be improved, especially on the left side of South Depot Street where existing sidewalks are in the worst condition.

In addition, parking spaces on both Main Street and Depot Street should be clearly delineated as separate from travel lanes. Adding curb extensions at the intersection would help provide additional space for people walking, safer crossings, and a more pleasant streetscape. South Depot Street is wide enough to accommodate both widened sidewalks and clearly delineated on-street parking. Parking and sidewalk improvements should include provisions for future sidewalks north along North Depot Street into the neighborhood north of downtown.

Today Main Street through Cleveland is lined with homes and rows of small shops. Reducing the speed limit from 35 miles per hour to 25 through Downtown Cleveland would help Main Street act more like a community road, being safer for pedestrians and better fitting the surrounding context.

Additional Constraints and Challenges

Reconstructing the northeast curb will likely require relocation of the utility pole at the corner and may encroach partially onto the property of the neighboring house.

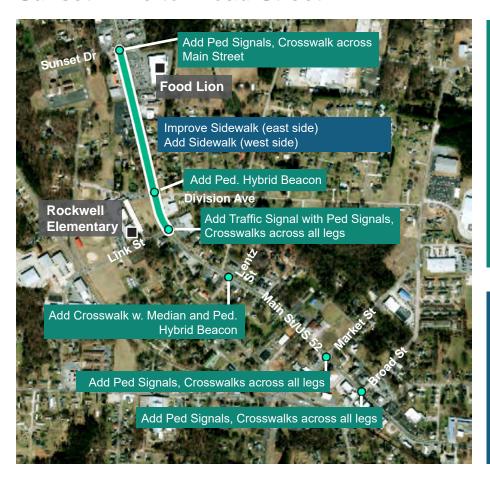
If the crossing will remain unsignalized, warning signage should be added prior to the intersection on Main Street and Maple Street alerting drivers of the upcoming crosswalk.

The striping of parking lanes would need to be designed to retain entrances to parking lots on the southwest and southeast corners of the intersection.

Current Condition

Main Street (US 52) serves as the primary roadway through Rockwell, connecting to Salisbury and Granite Quarry to the north and Gold Hill and Richfield to the southeast. Main Street also acts as the primary roadway serving Rockwell's downtown. The corridor is mostly lined with small scale retail, homes, and churches. Additional retail is located at the westernmost end of the corridor, including a strip mall with a Food Lion. Rockwell Elementary is also located along the corridor, with the Rockwell School Drive/Division Street and Link Street intersections as major access points for the school.

Main Street (US 52) has two 12' through lanes and a 12' bi-directional center turn lane west of Market Street and two extra wide through lanes from just east of Market Street to Broad Street. The corridor has a speed limit of 35 miles per hour through the downtown area. The Rowan-Cabarrus Comprehensive Transportation Plan (CTP) does not show any expected roadway improvements along the corridor.

Within this portion of Main Street, the only existing marked crosswalk across Main Street is at Division Avenue/Rockwell School Drive, near Rockwell Elementary. Currently, none of the signalized intersections have pedestrian signals. While the Market Street and Depot Street intersections have curb ramps, several ramps are only properly angled for crossing Main Street and have no accessible provision for crossing the cross street.

The northern/eastern side of Main Street is lined with narrow sidewalks along almost the entire corridor, stopping short of Sunset Drive, while the southern/western side only has narrow sidewalks east of Link Street. Both stretches of sidewalks are frequently obstructed by utility poles.

Recommendations

Main Street Corridor from Sunset Drive to Link Street

Sidewalks should be improved, completed, or added along both sides of Main Street from Sunset Drive to Link Street. This includes extending the north/east sidewalk to the Sunset Drive intersection and adding sidewalks on the south/west side between Link Street and Sunset Drive.

Sunset Drive at Main Street

A signalized pedestrian crossing should be added at the Sunset Drive traffic light to allow people from neighborhoods west of Main Street to cross and reach CVS and Food Lion safely.

Division Avenue at Main Street

A Pedestrian Hybrid Beacon should be added at the existing crosswalk across Main Street at Division Avenue to improve the safety of crossings to Rockwell Elementary. The crossing across Division Avenue should also be marked.

Link Street at Main Street

A new traffic signal with pedestrian signals should be added at Link Street. A new crosswalk should also be added across Main immediately west of the intersection to ensure safe crossings to Rockwell Elementary.

Lentz Street at Main Street

Due to the staggered roadway alignments, it may be difficult to find the right location for a crosswalk at Lentz Street. One option is to add a crossing with median island immediately west of Shinn Street, minimizing disruptions to left turn lanes while providing a safer place for crossing pedestrians to wait. A Pedestrian Hybrid Beacon is appropriate for this location.

Market Street at Main Street

Crosswalks at Market Street should be marked. The southwest corner alongside the Rockwell Cafe should be improved to better accommodate pedestrians, including curb ramps and sidewalks.

Broad Street/Depot Street at Main Street

A full four way crossing with added pedestrian signals should be added at Main/Broad/Depot, with improvements to the curb ramps to accommodate pedestrians crossing Main Street.

Overall Considerations

All crosswalks should be marked or re-marked with high visibility zebra markings. This style of crosswalk is broadly more visible to drivers and is less likely to fade quickly from wear and tear than simple horizontal lines. All curb ramps should be built or upgraded to ADA standards.

Additional Constraints and Challenges

Due to the additional lane for school buses, the crosswalk across Link Street is currently very long and crosses wide lanes. This could pose safety issues for people crossing here, especially with the location's proximity to Rockwell Elementary. It may be worth extending the striping separating the bus lane to the intersection to narrow the appearance of Link Street for non-school bus traffic and shorten the crossing for pedestrians.

There are several properties with parking lots that come right up to the travel lanes at the Market Street and Broad Street intersections. Improvement of sidewalks and curb ramps will impact properties of the Rockwell Cafe at Market St and 103 Main Street at Broad Street/Depot Street. Both locations may require utility relocation to complete. There is enough room with extra wide lanes in front of 103 Main Street to move the curb outwards to minimize impact to the existing property, but this may require additional costs for moving the curb.

Main Street is shown as a bicycle route between Link Street and Broad/Depot Streets in the Rowan-Cabarrus CTP. Despite the corridor's wide travel lanes, there does not appear to be space within the existing roadway for added bike lanes unless the center turn lane is removed. Future work on the sidewalks in this area could potentially include strategic widening of one sidewalk to a shared use path (~8' to 10' width) to provide bicycle accommodations along this stretch without needing to move the curb.

Significant portions of the existing sidewalks between Link Street and downtown Rockwell are obstructed by utility poles. In order to make the entire corridor fully accessible, these utility poles would need to be relocated, potentially requiring additional right of way or curb relocation. As this report only focuses on specific intersections along this section of Main Street, this broader utility relocation was not included in the estimated project cost.

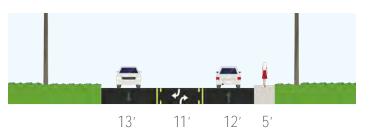

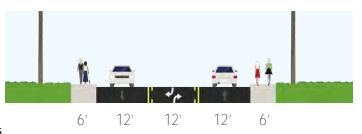
